### **EASTER VIGIL MILESTONES**

Take a moment to tell or think about a recent mountain high and/or valley low in your life.

### **CARING CONVERSATIONS**



Discuss in your home, small group, or use for personal reflections:

- What is one of your favorite Bible stories? Why is it important to you?
- The Bible tells the story of God's saving deeds and our human frailty. What is something about the story of God's love and mercy for us that continues to surprise you?

#### DEVOTIONS



Read: Romans 6:3-11.

The Easter Vigil is the earliest Christian worship service observed annually. It is the time to gather as a worshiping community, hear the story of God's saving work from biblical readings, and welcome in new brothers and sisters in the faith through baptism. Historically those who were to be baptized and were older had been shepherded by a Christian who helped them learn the faith, pray the Lord's Prayer, and live the Christian life. For the newly baptized, it was the first time they witnessed the Holy Communion liturgy and received the bread and wine, the body and blood of Christ in worship. All of this emphasized the new life in Christ by confessing the faith together, giving testimony to caring for widows, orphans, and others in need, and receiving the sacraments. The life of the baptized reflects the life that has died to the old way of living and is raised to live with Christ in all our relationships.

Discuss: How is it helpful to your faith journey to think or talk about your baptism? Pray: Eternal God, you who raised Jesus from the dead, we thank you that in baptism you bring us from death to walk in newness of life now and always. Amen.

# **SERVICE**



Jesus calls us to serve our neighbor in love. Based on the Daily Bible Readings for this day, how might you care for widows, orphans, and others in need?

### **RITUALS AND TRADITIONS**



During the Easter Vigil we are reminded of the many stories in the Bible about God saving God's people. The Easter Vigil is a time to read several Old Testament stories, sit quietly in reflection, and meditate on God's work in history. Gather around a fire pit or a lighted candle and tell one or more of the following stories in your own words or read them from the Bible: Creation, Noah and the Flood, Abraham offering Isaac as a sacrifice, the Exodus of the Israelites (Moses and the Red Sea), Jonah and the Whale, and the Fiery Furnace (Shadrach, Meshach and Abednego). After the stories, sit for a moment in silence.
