A Blessing to Give:



EASTER VIGIL MILESTONES

Take a moment to tell or think about a recent mountain high and/or valley low in your life.

CARING CONVERSATIONS

Discuss in your home, small group, or use for personal reflections:

- When you feel discouraged, what do you do? Who do you talk with?
- What amazes you and fills you with hope or excitement?



Read: Luke 24:1-12.

Easter is not only a time to focus on good news, but on amazing news. In a world where cynicism, divisions, and discouragement are present, it can be challenging to trust any rumors of hope. In our account of Christ's resurrection in Luke 24, the disciples go from hearing what seemed like *"an idle tale"* from women to something much more. Peter runs to Jesus' tomb and sees it as the women described it. Peter was amazed at what had happened. The Easter Vigil gives us the broader story of God's care for us and the goodness of God's creative and saving work so that we may have confidence in the amazing story of Jesus' resurrection. God does not want our lives to be dominated by cynicism or discouragement. God wants us to be truly amazed by the astonishing reality of God's love that is most fully seen in Jesus Christ's sacrifice of love from the cross and empty tomb.

Discuss: Do you identify most with the women, Peter, or the other apostles? Why? *Pray:* God of glory and might, we thank you that your ways are filled with hope and love for us and for all your creation through Christ Jesus our Savior and Lord. Amen.

SERVICE

Jesus calls us to serve our neighbor in love. Based on the Easter Vigil Bible Readings and theme for this day, to whom do you want to tell the amazing story of Jesus' love?

RITUALS AND TRADITIONS

The Easter Vigil begins at sunset. As darkness begins, we think of Genesis 1 and the creation story, *"and darkness covered the face of the deep"* (v. 2). At sunset, gather around a fire or light candles on a table to represent God's creation of light. This is a time to revisit sacred stories of our faith. As darkness grows, read the words listed here and tell what you remember of the story: God/Creation; Isaac/Sacrifice of Abraham; Moses/Red Sea; and Ezekiel/Valley of Dry Bones. Think about the new life God gives in these stories and the new life given to us through our baptism in Christ. After a moment of silence and gazing into the light, conclude by saying: Jesus Christ is the light of the world. The light no darkness can overcome.
