DEVOTIONS



Read: Matthew 25:31-46.

Jesus has a way of getting our attention. In this reading, he is speaking as the Son of Man coming in triumph at the end of time. In the Gospel of Matthew Jesus emphasizes discipleship. What does it mean to be a follower of Jesus, to be obedient to his word? If we listen to Jesus' parable (perhaps less a parable and more a final teaching emphasis before his death and resurrection), we can certainly worry about our eternal judgment. But that would miss the point of Jesus' teaching. His words are all about a life of mercy. We see this in his opening message in the Beatitudes and the Sermon on the Mount (Matthew 5:3-16). In Jesus' final teaching moment before his crucifixion, those on the king's right hand don't even know they have served the king (and others) with mercy. Actions count. Jesus wants our life of faith as disciples and our actions to be based on God's mercy given to us and extended through us to others.

Discuss: As we look to the year ahead, how do we start fresh and pursue a life of mercy, the same mercy we have received from God in Christ?

Pray: Merciful God, help us to see and to trust your undeserved kindness that we may gladly care for others as you have cared for us through Jesus Christ, the Son of Man. Amen.

SERVICE



Jesus calls us to serve our neighbor in love. Based on the New Year's Bible Readings and theme for this day, how can you show compassion and mercy to someone in need?

RITUALS AND TRADITIONS



Gather on New Year's Eve or Day to give thanks for the past year and to ask for God's blessing on the year to come. Provide glasses for all gathered to share in a toast. Light a candle to represent the presence of Christ.

Pray: God of yesterday, today, and tomorrow, thank you for a new year of blessings, opportunities, and challenges. Help us to live this year with faith in our hearts and praises on our lips. Amen.
