Beginning with Palm Sunday recalling the events from the triumphal entry, with a nod to what will happen, from the upper room where Jesus gathered for the last time with his disciples to the foot of the cross and finally, the joy of the empty tomb. COUNCIL MINUTES SUMMARY

March 8, 2021

Board/Committee Reports:

Nominating Committee: Need to begin thinking about a person for Vice President for next year.

Elders: Need to establish a committee to carry out the Child & Youth Protection Program required by our insurance company; would like help from Nominating Committee in finding people for the committee.

Social Ministries: Forwarded check to ELCA Hunger Program.

Trustees: The blinds were hung in the sanctuary.

Worship & Music: Still need to expand the media team. The Lenten series is excellent.

Parish Education: JAM sent out 32 valentines to congregants who live by themselves, which was a big hit. Souper Bowl of Caring collection is now nearly \$800. EPIC kids will be doing Good Friday; there are no confirmands being confirmed this year. VBS may be a weekend program this summer.

Financial Report: Beginning Balance: \$48,332 Ending Balance: \$52,371 This includes having paid for the new doors in the Narthex. Balance includes checks deposited into the General Account from the Endowment Fund for the Lakota Center and Cat/Pup Pack program. These will be paid in March.

Pastor's/Staff Reports: Kids are on Lenten break. Angie will be out of town for Easter, has tapped Jack Martin to direct the Good Friday performance. Hoping there are enough kids to cover all the Good Friday parts. 1st Communion Class will be March 21st with First Communion on Maundy Thursday. Nancy Steele's PMA certification 25th anniversary is this year. Synod recognition will happen during the (Zoom) Assembly. Calvary will schedule a celebration locally. Board of Elders will handle planning the celebration.

<u>Old Business:</u> BBQ – thinking we should do it like last year, as a BBQ-less BBQ. Last year's take was equal to other years. Dennis Gorr moved and Neal Blomenkamp 2nd that we continue with a BBQ-less BBQ, with \$75 being the suggested donation. Motion carried. Lakota Center Matching Grant – when last known, they were still about \$5,500 short. Neal Blomenkamp moved to donate the BBQ earnings to the Lakota matching grant. Dennis Gorr 2nd motion accepted.

<u>New Business:</u> Council Workshop – discussion of its need; recommended we not do one this year. Mary Jo Huelle moved on behalf of the Endowment Committee, with Jim Dorn 2nd, to change signers for the Calvary Lutheran Church Mission Endowment Fund checking account as follows: continue with Bill Steele and Lonnie Miller as signers; add Bill Huelle as a 3rd signer; remove Monty Copsey as signer. Motion accepted.

The 4G network developed by our own Nebraska Synod has produced a series of short video clips guiding you and your family, or a friend (or two, or three!) through a wonderfully simple devotional practice called the Faith 5. All you will need is your Bible, no devotional book, commentary or study book. (Oh, and a willingness to talk!)

Once a month we will highlight one of these videos with people across the Nebraska Synod sharing together this simple way to talk, pray and learn. They will literally demonstrate sharing their 'highs' and 'lows', reading a scripture text, talking about it, (simply adding your thoughts, not what a commentary or even Pastor has to say about it), then pray for one another's highs and lows and finally bless one another. (A simple, "May you be aware of God's presence this day." is sufficient.) There will be opportunities to pause the video and add your own highs/lows, comments, prayers and blessing.

You can do this with your family, (from toddlers to greatgrandparent), a friend or neighbor, a fellow member of Calvary or even someone from another church. All you need is a Bible and a way to access the video.

For the members of Calvary, we are going to set up two trees, a 'Zoom' tree, (for those who wish to connect by computer) and a phone tree (for those without computers or internet access or who simply prefer to connect by phone). To participate, simply call, email or stop in the office and say, "please add me to the phone tree or Zoom tree" and we will do the rest.

We are also looking for people with internet access who would be willing to host one of the phone groups which means you would pull up the video and share it with those who are joining via phone. Once you have listened to the video together you would then share highs/lows, thoughts, prayers and blessings with one another.

The videos run a whole ten minutes! Which means you share/read/talk/pray/bless for another 10 minutes. The entire process can be done in 20 minutes! The overall theme of the scripture texts is generosity and encourages us to see our God as a generous God. We are starting with December's video which is #12 in the series. We will post the other 11 in no particular order. It doesn't matter. What matters is the opportunity to see (or listen to how Faith 5 can work for you and allow you to practice this. Sign up, or go ahead and create your group, establish a time that works, head to Calvarylutheranscottsbluff.org and look for the video under 'Faith Formation'.






