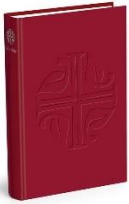

Hymnal Available to Borrow

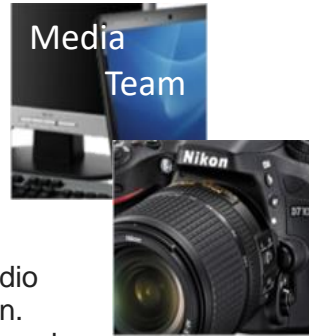
