God's Work, Our Hands Sunday October 10, 2021

For God's Work, Our Hands Sunday we will again be assembling school kits for Lutheran World Relief. We are asking you to collect the following supplies which we will assemble on Sunday, October 10 following worship. Please review the list carefully as ONLY the items listed below can be sent in the backpacks. Also please note, nothing can have religious



messaging or patriotic symbols or camouflage. Collection boxes will be in the breezeway. Start collecting now and take advantage of 'Back to School' sales!!!

INCLUDE THE FOLLOWING IN EACH SCHOOL KIT

- 4--70-sheet notebooks of wide- or college-ruled paper, approximately 8" x 10 ½"; no loose leaf paper
- 1--30-centimeter ruler, or a ruler with centimeters on one side and inches on the other
- 1--pencil sharpener
- 1--pair of blunt scissors (safety scissors with embedded steel blades work well)
- 5--unsharpened #2 pencils with erasers; secure together with a rubber band 5--black or blue ballpoint pens (no gel ink); secure together with a rubber band
- 1--box of 16 or 24 crayons ONE 2 ½" eraser
- 1--sturdy drawstring backpack-style cloth bag, approximately 14" x 17" with shoulder straps (no standard backpacks) (Can be made by hand, go to the LWR website for instructions.)



As you come toward the end of another summer, I have a challenge for you. First a reflection on that difficult text from Luke. Two sisters, one family. Each expressed her devotion to Jesus, either in action or in reflection. Martha was given to serving and achieving as a way of honoring Jesus, their guest; Mary was given to attentiveness and conversation. When being and doing have found a balance within us there is the possibility of health and wholeness. Our being must be fed and nurtured if our doing is to be strong and wise. It is the message Martha needed to hear from Mary to be sure, but it was also a message that Mary needed to hear from Martha. Mary's listening and Martha's serving were complementary parts of the same whole; each needed the other. The power and energy of a melody is only half-strength without the imagination and images of the lyrics.

"Faith without works is dead," James wrote, and so also works without faith. Words without deeds are dead, as are agendas without actions, worship without education, leadership without discipleship. We are invited into a relationship of honoring our guest that requires our hearts as well as our hands. In the balance we will find completeness. For life is lived in this ebb and flow of rest and work. Grace and growth can happen amid the rhythm of reflection and action. Only do not be distracted from the one thing that is needful: the presence of the guest who brings grace and understanding to our living. We should never be so consumed by our tasks or so lost in our thoughts that we fail to live in relationship with the source of all life—Jesus.

Balance. Covid shook up our sense of balance. We are still wobbling and attempting to regain it. You see it in Churches and in Wall Street. The challenge for us is now ministering to an online and in-person world and the question before us is, "How do we now find a balance?" We have people we are connecting with via the internet and livestream but not in person. We have faithful in-person members that do not connect with us online. How do we reach both? Like the challenge of Martha and Mary, listening and serving, we must work to do both and do both to the best of our abilities. Specifically, how do we connect the non-

online and the online together? Is it possible? Is it something we can achieve? Second, how do we use our online presence to draw others into an in-person connection while understanding for various reasons they may still be hesitant to have contact with a large or even a small group? Balance, hopefully something we can achieve and help us to grow.

COUNCIL MINUTES SUMMARY

July 12, 2021

Minutes will be corrected to add the discussion of showing our appreciation to the Fire Department for their help in testing the Tower Bells. It was decided we would offer tickets to our annual Barbecue for 2022 to them.

Board and Committee Reports:

Outreach: VBS invites have been developed and will be mailed out end of this week. Facebook Page graphic is being developed. Whiting Signs will be installing the Mission Statement on the wall in the narthex this week.

Trustees: Parking Lot has been paved & striped; Discussion of how to remove pigeons that have taken up residence in courtyard; discussion of some new gutters; new doors have been installed but electric will still need to be installed for the motorized electric connection; discussion of continuing the installation of the Ring Doorbell process

Parish Education: the board did not meet but Angie reported that Owls had met with an attendance of 10 and a meal and movie was enjoyed. They will continue meeting. Vacation Bible School will be July 23-25th and mailers will be mailed to notify Congregation and anyone interested in coming. They are working on the programming.

Financial Report: Beginning Balance: \$ 56,867.10 Ending Balance: \$ 55,910.94 **Pastor/Staff Reports:** Pastors had been on vacation. They are continuing working on Shut-in Visitations. They also will be talking to Nancy about getting the Deacons back to taking communion to our shut-ins on a monthly basis.

<u>Old Business:</u> Ice Cream Social 9-12-2021 to be headed by Council – Dennis Gorr graciously volunteered to head this up for the council, Received a Thank You Letter of appreciation from Sullivan Hills Camp for our gift of \$500

New Business: Hybrid Church Webinar Series – Pastors presented a webinar series which will be an overview of several areas of congregational ministry and reflect on how to begin to move every aspect of church life to a dual platform – on-the-ground and online. This "hybrid" kind of ministry will be the new norm for the next season in most congregations' work. After discussion it was decided we would, as the Church Council participate in this 5 week series beginning on July 26th. It was decided we would have it available at the church and online for those who could not attend. This will be advertised and offered to the congregation as well. Pastors will be getting information of how to register for this and completing the electronic part to be presented in the church over already established communication. It was also decided not to have an August 9th Council Board meeting in lieu of this presentation.






