Remember the old Myth Busters? I loved that show! They took popular urban myths or legends about all kinds of things and tried to prove or disprove if they could have happened the way the legend says. Like sticking your finger in the end of a gun, (a nice Bugs Bunny/Elmer Fudd routine), but of course, it cannot happen in real life. They proved it couldn't! (No they didn't stick their finger in the end of a gun; they used a fake finger kind of like a crash test dummy affair.) They even took on the menthos/coke eruptions. Yes, it works but what they couldn't do was break it down and explain how or why.


What if we applied that to Christmas? No, not Christmas itself, there is enough historical evidence for that. I'm talking about some of the things that have sprung up around Christmas and confuse us. They range from the simply distracting like how many magi were there anyway, to the downright pernicious; like, does Santa really keep a 'naughty or nice' list? While this may help young children fueled by sugar cookies and other Christmas treats hold their energy levels down, this can adversely affect our faith. We begin to think that God has a 'naughty and nice' list and that we better be 'good' so that we can get to heaven. No matter how much we proclaim faith in the work of Jesus Christ for our salvation, I am truly frustrated at how often Christianity is perceived as a 'Santa Claus' religion; if you are 'good enough, you will get into heaven!" That's definitely a myth that needs busting! Eternal Life comes by grace through faith and that is a gift of God, (yes, Ephesians 2:8).

So, what other myths or Christmas 'urban legends' need busting? Could be that already happened for you last year. I must confess last year toppled a myth I had long perpetuated. I would stand before the congregation on the Sunday the youth were to do their program and proclaim it just doesn't seem like Christmas until the youth bring us the Christmas story. Well, last year we couldn't have the youth program and though it wasn't the same, Christmas was still celebrated. Since last year was turned on its head, and many of our Christmas traditions literally went out the

window, this year gives us an opportunity; an opportunity to bust some myths and start anew especially recapturing the important stuff like celebrating Immanuel, God with us, instead of stressing over whether our Christmas presents will make it off the shipping containers in time. Instead we can put our focus on celebrating God's coming and the hope and promise that God will come again.

Maybe one of the biggest myths that needs busting is proclaiming, 'Merry Christmas' because for some Christmas just isn't all that 'merry'. And no, Christmas won't be ruined if the salesclerk says to you, "Happy Holidays." because despite what anyone else might say, God still comes and God still speaks to us, "Peace on Earth, good will to all." So bust some myths this year and find God born anew among us.

### November 8, 2020

**Nominating Committee**: Many invitations are out – not receiving many responses.

**Scholarship Committee**: Kaitlyn Todd will be returning to Concordia University; Emma Foote returning to Hastings College. Moved to grant \$701 to each. Motion passed.

### **Board/Committee Reports:**

**Elders:** Background checks on our staff & volunteers who work with the youth are now set up for the company to perform. This is being done in keeping with our insurance company's requirements.

**Social Ministries:** Will be meeting Wednesday. Worked on Habitat for Humanity last week. Notice is only coming 1-2 days ahead of need for workers. Laundry Love will be provided the 3<sup>rd</sup> weekend of each month, Calvary will be in a 3-month rotation with other churches. January 15th will be Calvary's first time to host it. Maunette Loeks will coordinate it. Angel Tree will be happening in December – more information to follow.

**Trustees:** Several exterior areas need painting. Couple of different issues with the smaller exterior cross. Got the sprinkler system finished and winterized, sod around the pavement. Looking to get a commercial grade lock for the kitchen door.

**Worship & Music:** Jim needs help with working the soundboard on Sundays; fall decoration of altar area done.

**Parish Education:** Average 12-14 on Wednesdays for JAM; planning a Christmas program during church service Dec.19<sup>th</sup>. EPIC doing things with First Methodist youth. Confirmation going well; plan on caroling on Dec. 15<sup>th</sup>. OWLS had good attendance. Generosity program will be November 21<sup>st</sup>.

**Financial Report:** Beginning Balance: \$45,586.66Ending Balance: \$57,775.15 Overall a very solid month. **Pastor's /Staff Reports:** Baptism on Nov 28<sup>th</sup>- Maeve Singer. New member Sunday will be Dec. 12th.

<u>Old Business:</u> Memorial Committee would like any ideas for use of Memorial Funds. Suggestions included chairs need to be replaced, some additional tables would be nice, so they don't have to be carried back and forth. Council Dinner date will be set in December for January. Board budget worksheets are out, due back by December.

**New Business:** The Scottsbluff (school system) preschool is looking for an off-site location for minimum of 1 or possibly 2 semesters while their new facility is being built. They came to look at back rooms. They would need outdoor space as well. Very exploratory at this point. Estimates of getting it ready are \$10-15K. Suggested that if they select us, they pay for the upgrades needed. Annual meeting date set - Neal Blomenkamp moved, Dennis Gorr 2<sup>nd</sup>, to hold the Annual meeting January 30, 2022. No budget forum will be held, due to lack of interest in previous years. Motion made by Dawn Holub, 2<sup>nd</sup> by Neal Blomenkamp to remove William Steele and Lonnie Miller signatures from the signature card and bank statement for the Calvary Endowment Fund. New signature cards will have James Dorn, Bill Huelle and Monty Copsey as signers. Mailed bank statements should read Attn: James Dorn.

### **Reverse Advent Calendar**

Often an Advent calendar is used to count down the days until Christmas by opening a box and discovering an ornament or something that helps you focus on the Advent journey. A reverse Advent calendar focuses on giving something instead of receiving – a Christ centered idea indeed – since Christmas is all about God giving himself to us as a baby.

The idea behind a reverse Advent calendar is simple. Pick out a sturdy basket, box or bag and fill it with food donations for your local food pantry – one item for every day in December. Then, when your bags are full, take them to the food pantry or drop them off here at Church.

This simple Advent idea encourages us to think of others as we wait to celebrate Jesus' birthday. What a great way to serve this Advent!

- Add one item a day or purchase several items every time you shop.
- Collect 25 items from your whole family or 25 items from each member in your family.
- Start collecting the items in the middle of November or wait until the beginning of December.

Focus on food items or practical donations or a combination of both.

You can create the reverse Advent calendar however you and your family choose.

You can include some of the most requested food donations such as:

Canned vegetables, applesauce – jars, pouches or individual cups, canned fruit, instant potatoes, canned soups, spaghetti sauce and pasta, pancake mix, canned meats (tuna, chicken, beef stew, etc), peanut butter and jelly, macaroni & cheese, cereal, instant oatmeal, granola bars, biscuit or baking mixes, particularly those that require only water, boxed meals that require only water

If you would prefer to focus on helping such efforts as the Doves Program you might consider the following:

Deodorant, body wash, toothbrushes, toothpaste, bar soap, razors, shampoo & conditioner, diapers, baby wipes, toilet paper, laundry detergent, new underwear, undershirts and socks are always needed!

Calvary already gives generously to the pantry, this idea can merge what you already do with the celebration of Advent and help young children learn the importance of giving.

### **Coffee and Fellowship**


