"I am bringing you good news of great joy for all the people" - Luke 2:10

Have you noticed? The days are getting shorter. The temperatures are dropping. The darkness seems to extend farther around us a bit more each week. Some say it is "the most wonderful time of the year!" Christmas lights appear, holiday songs begin to play, and shopping deals abound. For some this is a season of hope and expectation, but for others this is a season of darkness and maybe even a little despair.

The word Advent means Arrival. But just what is it exactly that is arriving?

During the Thanksgiving Day Parade in New York City, I watched on the television as commentators provided their thoughts about the various floats and bands. Then something BIG happened — Santa Claus and his reindeer came down Sixth Avenue! The commentators were thrilled, exclaiming, "now the holiday season has officially started!"

Is that the arrival for which we are waiting? Santa Claus? Or is it the arrival of the much anticipated holiday sales? A Nebraska win over lowa — is that what we were waiting for? (No comment!)

During this season of growing darkness, the church has a different way of viewing God's work in the world. The first Sunday of Advent is the beginning of a new church year — reminding us that God is doing a new thing among us, even In the midst of darkness. Advent is a season of waiting... awaiting the arrival of God's son, Jesus the Christ.

While parades, shopping, and lights dazzle and cry for our attention, God is preparing to enter the world. Not with glitz and fame, but in a manger with lowly shepherds as his guests. He is called "Emmanuel" — God with us.

I wonder how this holiday season feels to you? Is it a season of joy and anticipation? Or are you dreading the approaching holidays? However you feel, we can trust that God is coming down to be with us. In the darkest season, while the winds may howl and storms may come, God is coming to be near to us. He comes to us as a vulnerable, weak, and helpless baby; needy and dependent on others for his care.

Whatever you are facing this holiday season, whether it is good gifts or intense grief — God is with you. With faith and humility, may we all prepare our hearts for his arrival.

COUNCIL MINUTES SUMMARY

November 8, 2020

We did a Dwelling in the Word exercise led by Pastor Brett.

Board/Committee Reports:

Elders: They discussed if there were possible people coming to worship that may want to become members-that was a negative. Discussed Pastor Brett going to visit our shut ins. Had a discussion on the future of Saturday night services with it being hit or miss with the amount of people coming to that service.

Social Ministries: They will be meeting on Thursday 11/17/22. The CROP walk went well and collectively raised \$2,883 from three congregations.

Trustees: They are working on replacing the ceilings in the hallway. They changed the filters in the heating system. All is working well.

Worship & Music: It was decided to not do a combined service with Rejoice after all. We are doing a food drive for our Harvest Sunday Festival. Still discussing where we will take our donations. Possibly CAPWN. Getting geared up for the Advent and Christmas services. We will continue to wear nametags on Sundays for those that would like to. They discussed the logistics of the Saturday night service.

Parish Education: JAM is going well. Christmas program will be 12/11/22 during the church service. EPIC is going well - it's a small and close group. They plan to go caroling in December.

Endowment committee: We are sending information to a family that may be interested in a giving a gift to the church.

Financial Report: Beginning Balance for June: \$18,326 Ending Balance: \$17,922. A motion was made to pay the Scottsbluff Fire Department \$300 as a donation for the inspection of the Bell tower. Neal Blomen-kamp moved to accept; Jim Dorn 2nd-accepted. The treasurer's report was given by Mary Jo Huelle. Dennis Gorr moved to accept; Neal Blomenkamp 2nd-accepted.

Pastor's /Staff Reports: Pastor Brett has been visiting several church members (shut ins), etc. Confirmation has anywhere from 4-7 students-it's going well. He shared the congregational surveys with us and encouraged feedback. JAM has around 10-15 students. We have some college kids that enjoy helping with this. Pastor Brett updated the church website. Saturday night services were discussed. How should we handle the low attendance of this service? Pastor Brett will be offering first communion and new member classes, upcoming soon. The adult book study on Sunday mornings has been well attended.

<u>Old Business:</u> We discussed Adult Bible stud/education during the Pastor's report. We discussed the Nominating committee and what/how many were needed on each board. We discussed how our church profile is coming along and how the call committee will work.

New Business: Pastor Brett covered this in the Pastor/Staff Reports. Emma Foote will receive the endowment scholarship for the spring semester. Dennis Gorr made a motion to accept the amount of \$1,231; Neal Blomenkamp 2nd; accepted. The Council Dinner was proposed for January 2023. The annual meeting will be January 29, 2023, following the church service.





Reverse Advent Calendar

Often an Advent calendar is used to count down the days until Christmas by opening a box and discovering an ornament or something that helps you focus on the Advent journey. A reverse Advent calendar focuses on giving something instead of receiving – a Christ centered idea indeed – since Christmas is all about God giving himself to us as a baby.

The idea behind a reverse Advent calendar is simple. Pick out a sturdy basket, box or bag and fill it with food donations for your local food pantry – one item for every day in December. Then, when your bags are full, take them to the food pantry or drop them off here at Church.

This simple Advent idea encourages us to think of others as we wait to celebrate Jesus' birthday. What a great way to serve this Advent!

- Add one item a day or purchase several items every time you shop.
- Collect 25 items from your whole family or 25 items from each member in your family.
- Start collecting the items in the middle of November or wait until the beginning of December.

Focus on food items or practical donations or a combination of both.

You can create the reverse Advent calendar however you and your family choose.

You can include some of the most requested food donations such as:

Canned vegetables, applesauce – jars, pouches or individual cups, canned fruit, instant potatoes, canned soups, spaghetti sauce and pasta, pancake mix, canned meats (tuna, chicken, beef stew, etc), peanut butter and jelly, macaroni & cheese, cereal, instant oatmeal, granola bars, biscuit or baking mixes, particularly those that require only water, boxed meals that require only water

If you would prefer to focus on helping such efforts as the Doves Program you might consider the following:

Deodorant, body wash, toothbrushes, toothpaste, bar soap, razors, shampoo & conditioner, diapers, baby wipes, toilet paper, laundry detergent, new underwear, undershirts and socks are always needed!

Calvary already gives generously to the pantry, this idea can merge what you already do with the celebration of Advent and help young children learn the importance of giving.
