




Calvary is starting off the New Year with a bang!

COUNCIL MINUTES SUMMARY

November 13, 2023

Acceptance of Agenda – Bill Huelle moved to accept; Neal Blomenkamp 2nd - accepted. Acceptance of minutes from October 9, 2023: Grant Hinze moved to accept; Neal Blomenkamp 2nd – accepted.

Board/Committee Reports:

Elders: They met and discussed the Saturday night services and went over the church budget.

Trustees: They are working on the bells in the bell tower. Also, working on heat tape for the down spouts for the wintertime.

Stewards: They met in passing about the budget

Parish Education: The Christmas program will be 12/10/23. Maunette and Val are working on a questionnaire to get an idea of what the young adults would be interested in doing as a group here at Calvary. Thoughts were expressed that this would be a good project for them to work together with the outreach team.

The Call Committee: We will wait to see how the church members vote on Sunday 11/19/23.

Worship and Music: They met and joined in with the Elders on their discussion about Saturday night services. They also discussed the budget. They are purchasing some large Christmas banners that we will be using this Christmas season.

Endowment: They have received one application so far. All applications are due by the end of December.

Social Ministry: They discussed Habitat for Humanity, and they were made aware of several high school kids that are working on the projects right now. The Angel tree will be going up on 12/2. The gifts that are bought for the Angel tree need to be back at the church on 12/15/23, to be dispersed. Bell Ringing will be going on at Safeway on Saturday, 12/9/23. They are working on helping a family that needs help correcting their water supply to their house and the needs of a new furnace. They also discussed their budget.

Nominating Committee: They met, and they have a list of people they are contacting about serving on different boards/committees.

Financial Report: Beginning Balance for October: \$30,977- Ending Balance: \$37,032

Pastor's /Staff Reports: PMA Bill Huelle reported that things are going well. He has a couple of dates in December that he is still working on pulpit supply.

<u>Old Business:</u> Advent starts on 12/3/23. Budget worksheets are due 11/13/2023 or before the next Council meeting which is 12/11/23. The church annual meeting is Sunday 1/28/24. A motion was made to hold the annual meeting on Sunday 1/28/24. Grant Hinze moved to accept; Neal Blomenkamp 2nd- accepted.

<u>New Business</u>: Annual reports are due before the Council meeting on 12/11/23. We went over preparing for the vote of our Pastoral candidate on 11/19/23. Resolution of extending a call to Pastor Kathryn Montira and resolution of initial annual compensation package. Neal Blomenkamp moved to accept; Debbie Brown 2^{nd} – accepted.

December Mission Project ANGEL TREE MINISTRY

The Social Ministry Board is again sponsoring the Angel Tree. Paper ornaments will be on the Angel Christmas tree outside the Fellowship Hall with first name, age, and gift idea. Names are from the Lakota Lutheran Center.

Don't forget to sign out your ornament on the table next to the tree and be sure to MATCH the number on the ornament with the number on the sheet. Suggested value of the gift is around \$25.

While we encourage consistency, we know some like to throw something 'extra' into the gift. It's the nature of a child to think everything should be fair and equal; therefore the Lakota Center distributes the gifts at their celebration and then sends them home to open them. Because of this, the gifts need to be <u>securely sealed</u>, preferably boxed so that the children are not tempted to 'look'



and reach into a gift sack that is simply covered by colored paper. While the gifts are certainly valued and appreciated, the Lakota Center would really appreciate your help in this small way to make sure the children have a joyous gathering celebrating the birth of Jesus.
