Transfiguration of Our Lord

February 23, 2020



Jesus is revealed as the promised Messiah. Jesus is revealed to be the Messiah when he is transfigured on the mountaintop. The three disciples saw Jesus' clothes become dazzling white. A voice spoke from heaven saying that Jesus is God's son, the Beloved and we are to listen to him. The transfiguration is a preview of Jesus' resurrection and his power over life and death.

Daily Bible Readings @ Home

Sunday – Read Mark 9:2-8 Jesus is transfigured on the mountaintop and a voice from the cloud says, 'This is my Son, the Beloved; listen to him!'. How do you best listen to God? Take time today to practice whatever it is that helps you listen to God?

Monday – Read Mark 9:9-13 Following the Transfiguration, Jesus leads the disciples back down the mountain, where things are not as clear as they were up on the mountain. Name a time when you saw God clearly in your life. How can that time strengthen your faith when life gets a little muddled?

Tuesday – Read Mark 9:14-29 Another father approaches Jesus asking for healing for his child in which he utters one of the most honest statements in scripture, "I believe, help my unbelief." If you or someone you know is facing a crisis, pray not simply for healing or resolution but for the strengthening of their faith.

Wednesday – Read Mark 9:30-37 Jesus foretells his death and resurrection. Today is the beginning of Lent. Attend an Ash Wednesday service, if you are able. If not, make the sign of the cross on your forehead and reflect on what Jesus' death and resurrection means for you.

Thursday – Read Mark 9:38-50 Jesus cautions the disciples against putting a stumbling block in the way of someone else's faith. Make a list of things which might cause others to stumble in their faith. Ask for forgiveness for any you might have done.

Friday – Read Mark 10:1-12 The pharisees use the issue of divorce to try and trap Jesus. Jesus responds by lifting up the goodness of marriage, but also recognizing the reality of broken relationships. Pray for those living with the reality of divorce in their lives.

Saturday – Read Mark 10:13-16 Jesus blesses little children. Donate some new or gently used clothes or toys to a local agency that provides services for children.
