Lent is coming! And just in time for Lent we are starting in-person worship! There will still be 'distancing' and masks and limited singing etc. but we will celebrate Holy Communion and gather as the people of God. And yes, we will continue to livestream the worship service, that is a permanent change that will go forward with us from now on; a reminder that we are headed forward and not returning to where we were, even if a lot of that has yet to be figured out.

As I contemplated the decision to open again to in-person worship and the beginning of Lent on February 17th, Ash Wednesday, I thought how fitting it would be if we actually waited until Ash Wednesday to hold our first in-person worship for the first time in 2021. First, I am not saying all that transpired in 2020 needs repentance and confession. Yes, repentance and confession is a part of Ash Wednesday, but I want to be clear, Covid-19 was not God's punishment for our sins!

Recall what is spoken as the ashes are placed upon your forehead: 'You are dust and to dust you shall return'. As we ever so slowly begin to emerge from the grips of the pandemic, this past year has been a reminder of that truth, we are mortal, and we are as fragile as dust from which scripture reminds us we were created. God took the dirt and shaped it into Adam, the first human and from Adamah (dirt), God also formed Adam's companion Eve, dusty souls.

On the eve of his inauguration, President-elect Joe Biden attended a memorial to the 400,000 people who have lost their lives in this pandemic. 400,000 who returned, as we all will someday, to the dust. The memorial reminded us that mothers, fathers, sons, daughters, grandparents, cousins, aunts and uncles, friends and neighbors are no longer with us, and we all mourn their return to the ground.

Yet, the ashes also remind us we are connected. In a devotional, Sheryl gave me for Christmas this year, the writer pointed out the first Adamah (the Hebrew word for dust) came out of the ground. A second Adamah, also came out of the ground, the empty tomb, the resurrected adam, Jesus Christ. So in receiving the ashes we are also reminded that just as we are united with the first Adam, we are also united with the second, the resurrected Lord! In the ashes God has not forgotten us but claims us, frail as we are.

Please understand we may have to end in person worship again, this may take several fits and starts, but know this, we will by hook or by crook make the ashes available to you, to remind you that as we continue to struggle through God has claimed us, dusty souls that we are.

COUNCIL MINUTES SUMMARY

January 13, 2019

Board/Committee Reports:

Nominating Committee: Dawn Holub agreed to run as co-chair for Outreach Committee for a 1 year term; Stewards will be seeking a Chair throughout the year. Bill Huelle has agreed to stand as an alternate for Synod Assembly delegate if needed; suggested that boxes be added to the ballots for Annual Meeting. Ballot was approved for the annual meeting. Appointed new and returning members to the Boards for the coming year.

Endowment Committee: Grant request forms are in process, due the end of the month. Bill Huelle has agreed to be temporary active chair. Recommended that any Lenten dinner money previously made be requested from the Endowment Fund. Lenten dinners will probably not work this year.

Social Ministries: Pastor Chris reported on coffee discount given to hospital staff at the Emporium. Heard from several hospital employees who appreciated the gesture.

Trustees: Nativity scene up and down. Leak in sanctuary in northwest side, downspouts freeze and melt. Recommended some heat tape be added – being checked out. Doors for outside entrance have been ordered, the entrance will be centered and new side walk poured.

Worship & Music: Christmas Eve drive-by communion was extremely successful – around 55. Will meet this week at the church and decide about in-person worship but numbers are looking favorable to resume in-person worship on January 24th. Will be discussing Lent.

Financial Report: Beginning Balance: \$43,608.63 Ending Balance: \$56,897.43

Pastor's /Staff Reports: Survived Christmas Eve – felt really strange! People are really longing to come back to in person worship. Trying to figure out Lenten series.

<u>Old Business</u>: Constitution Amendments had only a clarification question. Jack mentioned end of Chapter 7, last paragraph has a semi colon – need to check if something is missing. Appears to be a typo, but will clarify before the Annual Meeting. (Note: 2 bullet points were accidently deleted which are already part of our constitution, so they were added back in.)

<u>New Business:</u> Approved Agenda for Annual Meeting – only change is the Amendment corrections. In-person or Zoom meeting for Annual Meeting: Council is voting to give authorization to the Executive Board to decide how the Annual Meeting will be conducted. New Council installation will be February 7th.

Next Council Meeting: February 8, 2021




February Mission Project

Yep, you read that right.



The 4G network developed by our own Nebraska Synod has produced a series of short video clips guiding you and your family, or a friend (or two, or three!) through a wonderfully simple devotional practice called the Faith 5. All you will need is your Bible, no devotional book, commentary or study book. (Oh, and a willingness to talk!)

Once a month we will highlight one of these videos with people across the Nebraska Synod sharing together this simple way to talk, pray and learn. They will literally demonstrate sharing their 'highs' and 'lows', reading a scripture text, talking about it, (simply adding your thoughts, not what a commentary or even Pastor has to say about it), then pray for one another's highs and lows and finally bless one another. (A simple, "May you be aware of God's presence this day." is sufficient.) There will be opportunities to pause the video and add your own highs/lows, comments, prayers and blessing.

You can do this with your family, (from toddlers to great-grandparent), a friend or neighbor, a fellow member of Calvary or even someone from another church. All you need is a Bible and a way to access the video.

For the members of Calvary, we are going to set up two trees, a 'Zoom' tree, (for those who wish to connect by computer) and a phone tree (for those without computers or internet access or who simply prefer to connect by phone). To participate, simply call, email or stop in the office and say, "please add me to the phone tree or Zoom tree" and we will do the rest.

We are also looking for people with internet access who would be willing to host one of the phone groups which means you would pull up the video and share it with those who are joining via phone. Once you have listened to the video together you would then share highs/lows, thoughts, prayers and blessings with one another.

The videos run a whole ten minutes! Which means you share/read/talk/ pray/bless for another 10 minutes. The entire process can be done in 20 minutes! The overall theme of the scripture texts is generosity and encourages us to see our God as a generous God. We are starting with December's video which is #12 in the series. We will post the other 11 in no particular order. It doesn't matter. What matters is the opportunity to see (or listen to how Faith 5 can work for you and allow you to practice this. Sign up, or go ahead and create your group, establish a time that works, head to Calvarylutheranscottsbluff.org and look for the video under 'Faith Formation'.


