LENT BEGINS





"I am the Bread of Life"

---Jesus

Bread for the Journey is the theme for our Wednesday night Lenten services this year. Bread is present throughout the pages of the Bible, but especially at key times In Israel's salvation history. This series will give us an opportunity to reflect on those 'bread' stories in ways that are particularly appropriate for Lent. As well, each week we will sample different breads as we explore together themes of hospitality, generosity, sufficiency, and trust which are like slices in the loaf of bread being served each week. Join us at 6:30 p.m. on Wednesday nights starting on March 2nd, Ash Wednesday for a high-carb, multi-sensory Lenten Worship Experience!





"We want our cake and we want it now!" That might be a good motto for today's world. With instant everything from text messaging to iced tea, everything is now on demand. Nothing new here, as preachers of the gospel, we have often raised a critique to our impatient society. I'm including myself here. Just the other day, I was in a 'big box store' fuming because there were three people ahead of me in the checkout line, and I couldn't understand why they didn't open another register. I accept the fact that I am caught up in this push for the 'now'.

We may think this is a modern malady, but the reality is humankind has always been impatient. The children of Israel couldn't wait a day in the wilderness for God to do something and it didn't get any better. In Isaiah 9:1-4, the writer speaks of God's salvation coming. At this point in history, Judah is the only thing left of the nation of Israel. The writer envisions the people of Israel in a time of oppression calling out for God's redemption. Yet the writer doesn't speak of God coming to them, but to the northern areas of Naphtali and Zebulon. That is, the writer is likening God's saving work to the rising sun. First it appears in the east and then spreads across the land. God's salvation won't come immediately to Judah, it will progress and it will take time. God's people wanted God to act now, God was telling them, "Be patient."

Be patient and know that God is at work. Patience is a supply chain issue for most of us, we wonder what the holdup is, where the bottleneck is and why we can't get things moving, is the growing complaint. It doesn't make sense there should be a shortage of baby formula for instance (yes, I listened to a report on that while I was exercising. Supposedly Enfamil and another brand are in short supply and the news channel thought it a good human interest story). The response of these companies to the reporter? Be patient, it should all work out in 4-6 weeks.

February is a good month to remind ourselves to be patient. Winter is still strong and spring seems too far away, we hope the ground hog doesn't see its shadow anyway and the myth of winter ending tugs strongly. February, a short month we say, soon it shall pass and give way to the ever changing winds of March. Yes, February will pass and spring will come. May this be a reminder that God is at work—is on the horizon bringing God's work of salvation to fruition. In the meantime—yup! practice patience.

COUNCIL MINUTES SUMMARY

January 10, 2022

Board/Committee Reports:

Outreach: Did not meet in December, ran a Christmas ad on the WTT terminal and in the paper.

Elders: Paperwork submitted for background checks – to comply with insurance company requirements.

Social Ministries: Starting Laundry Love this month, have \$82 in quarters donated so far; volunteers have signed up to cover this month. We serve 2-hour time frame every 3 months, sharing with other churches. We will host at a Scottsbluff laundromat. Angel tree went very well; Barb Jensen and Jack Martin attended the dedication of the Habitat for Humanity House.

Trustees: A quiet month, nothing major happened; Kent installed the front 'Ring' doorbell for added security when Christy or pastors are here by themselves.

Worship & Music: Attendance was 184 for Christmas service. Many were not from our congregation but guests of members.

Stewards: Working on a time and talent sheet, asking for requests from Boards about what their needs are.

Parish Education: Did not meet in December, Generosity project will be Jan 23rd. JAM will start again in January; cooks are returning to serve meals again. EPIC was postponed, Angie quarantined due to Covid in the family. OWLS cancelled due to weather.

Financial Report: Beginning Balance: \$48,305.08 Ending Balance: \$46,962.18

Pastor's /Staff Reports: Holy Apostles met and will plan to reimburse Calvary 6 percent more than last year for pastor's services to meet proposed salary increases. Report on Pastor Chris' Parkinson's – basically he is doing ok, working on speech therapy; no motor issues, non-motor issues are progressing. Cory Weitzel, a science teacher at Morrill HS & a regular Calvary worshipper will be guest speaker at Confirmation to talk about science from the perspective of a person of faith.

<u>Old Business:</u> Ballot draft for 2022 Council positions. Dennis Gorr volunteered to be the nominee for Vice President. He feels sure he can find a Worship Chair replacement, for 1 year term. "Vote for 2" needs to be added to the Endowment Committee, both 2 and 3 yr terms. Worship Committee name will be filled in after Monday meeting. Annual Meeting Agenda was approved with no additions.

New Business: Council devotions sign-up sheet – sent around. Council dinner January 20th, head count taken. Need to appoint new people to all Boards and anyone appointed for 2024, whose term is up at the end of this month. Jack Martin moved we approved all listed as those coming on in 2022. Thanks to LaDonna Schmidt and Kathy Randall for their service. Lenten Dinners – discussion about whether or not to hold dinners this year, Covid issue main issue. Consensus is to hold them and let people decide on their own about attendance.




February Mission Project




Prayer Requests
