Between the end of the Christmas season and the beginning of lent, there are five Sundays of "ordinary time." Not a very exciting name, really. Who wants to be ordinary?

The scripture passages during these five Sundays focus on the beginning of Jesus' ministry. Calling the first disciples, teaching

the beatitudes, and the sermon on the mount; these are the stories that fill this "ordinary time."

And yet, for the Andrew, Peter, James, and John, as well as the many people in the crowds who gathered to hear Jesus, these stories recount a season that changed their lives forever and set them on a new trajectory. These are big steps toward the future of Calvary Lutheran Church! We had a first communion class, a new member's class, and will have a few students confirmed on February 12.

This is not a season for apathy, but a season for rejoicing and celebration. God is doing great things in and among us at Calvary Lutheran Church!

Maybe that's why Jesus started his Beatitudes with the statement "Blessed are the...." Because he knew that we would experience so many different feelings in our lives. The apathy and the excitement, the joy and the sorrow; in all of it, we are blessed because Jesus has welcomed us into his kingdom. As you follow Jesus in this cold winter, may you live fully into the promise of

Jesus: You are blessed.

January 9, 2023

Dwelling in the Word: Pastor Brett

Acceptance of Agenda: Motion to accept agenda as modified: Bill Huelle; 2nd Dawn Holub, agenda accepted. Acceptance of Dec. 12, 2022 minutes: Motion to accept: Grant Hinze; 2nd Jim Dorn, minutes accepted

Board/Committee Reports:

Parish Education: OWLS, JAM, EPIC resume for January and the Sunday morning adult bible study was completed in December.

Worship and Music: Lenten season plans discussed, and they will again be asking for committees/groups that would like to serve Lenten meals to contact Bill Huelle. Christmas trees etc. were all removed from the sanctuary Sunday, Jan. 8, after worship.

Endowment Committee: Bill Huelle reporting; Applications for dispersement of monies are due January 31, 2023.

Nominating Committee: Things are OK and lists will be given to Christy.

Financial Report: December: Beginning Balance \$14,279.01 Ending Balance: \$17,062.42 Grant then presented the proposed budget for 2023. Motion to accept the budget: Jack Martin; 2nd Jim Dorn; Budget accepted

Pastor/Staff reports: Angie reported that OWL's luncheon on Wednesday January 4 was a success, EPIC Sunday the 9th had 5 kids present and they had a wonderful time, JAM will be Wednesday January 11, and they will have Pizza! Pastor Brett reported that the adult study Aging Faithfully completed with 8-12 participants, Christmas Eve attendance @ 5:00 service was 127 and 7:00 service was 40, Christmas Day service had 36 in attendance. He has made several visitations; he is planning a first communion class for January 15 after worship and a new member class for January 22nd after worship. He talked some about the pastor job description as well as the video he is working on for the MSP work due to Neal's current medical concerns.

<u>Old Business:</u> Annual reports to Christy ASAP, Pastor Brett reviewed his report. Nominating committee basically work completed, list will be given to Christy. Thank you to Dawn Holub for her service. Council dinner will be January 19th, 6:30 PM @ the Civic Center with a buffet and cost will be approximately \$23/person. Congregational Survey was sent to everyone on council and there were really "no surprises".

New Business: Mary Jo distributed copies of the MSP, a first draft, and pointed out specific areas in which she would like the council members to review and provide input to her. Three continuing resolutions were presented: Job Description for Pastor, Parental Leave, and Sabbatical Leave. A motion to accept the resolutions was made by Grant Hinze and 2nd by Jim Dorn. Motion accepted.
