



Guided by a Star

January 5, 2020



The feast of Epiphany (“manifestation”) concludes the Christmas season with a celebration of God’s glory revealed in the person of Jesus Christ. In Isaiah and Ephesians, that glory is proclaimed for all nations and people. Like the light of the star that guided the magi to Jesus, the light of Christ reveals who we are: children of God who are claimed and washed in the waters of baptism. We are sent out to be beacons of the light of Christ, sharing the good news of God’s love to all people.

Daily Bible Readings @ Home

Sunday – Read Matthew 2:1-12 The magi offer gold, a possession of kings; frankincense, used in ritual to indicate the presence of the deity; and myrrh, an oil used at the time of death as well as for anointing priests. Reflect on what the gift of the Magi tell us about Jesus’ identity and ministry.

Monday – Read Isaiah 60:1-16 Isaiah proclaims that the light of God’s goodness and blessing will soon displace the darkness of misery, despondency, and malaise in the nation. Pray for God’s light to shine dispelling the darkness of our world.

Tuesday – Read Ephesians 3:1-12 Paul states that he is a servant of the gospel. What does he mean? How are we also called to be servants of the gospel? What does that mean for you and how you live?

Wednesday – Read 1 Peter 5:1-11 Try to recall times that you have been especially aware that God cares for you. Did you feel free to ‘cast’ your anxieties on God? If not, why do you think that was so?

Thursday – Read Genesis 50:14-21 With the death of their father, Joseph’s brothers finally seek the forgiveness of Joseph. Joseph response is gracious and profound. Telling them that what they intended for harm, God used for good. All is forgiven. Is there someone you need to forgive or ask forgiveness from?

Friday – Read 2 Corinthians 12:1-10 Paul proclaims that ‘whenever I am weak, then I am strong.’ What do you think Paul means? Think about your own weaknesses; Journal about how you might find God’s strength in the midst of your weaknesses?

Saturday – Read Psalm 72:1-7, 10-14 The psalmist prays that the king will have care and concern for the poor, the weak and the needy. Throughout scripture God’s concern for the most vulnerable among us is made known. Make a donation to a ministry that helps the poor, the weak or the needy this week.
