



Annual Meeting January 31st Following 10 a.m. Worship

A word about this year's Annual meeting, because of continued concerns over Covid-19, there will most likely be a virtual (Zoom) component to our Annual Meeting this year. Details are still being worked out, so please watch your email and bulletins for information as we finalize plans for this year's Annual meeting.

As part of this year's Annual meeting, the congregation will be asked to vote on several amendments to our Constitution. Every 3 years, the Evangelical Lutheran Church in America (ELCA) holds a National Assembly and votes on changes to the Model Constitution for Congregations and in order for us to keep our Constitution up to date



and in line with the Model Constitution, we are asked to adopt the amendments approved at the National Assembly. The Council has reviewed the amendments and approved them for presentation at this year's Annual meeting. Copies of our Constitution with the proposed changes will be emailed to everyone we have an email address for and copies will also be available outside of the church office for you to pick up at your convenience. If you have any questions about any of the changes and/or amendments, please talk with Pastors Chris or Sheryl.

COUNCIL MINUTES SUMMARY

December 14, 2020

Board/Committee Reports:

Nominating Committee: Haven't found a replacement for Mary Jo as chair of the Outreach Board yet. Board of Stewards still needs one more person. Board of Trustees staggered their appointments so that not all members terms end in the same year. Clarification was made that the Council appoints Board members at their January meeting.

Elders: Did not meet in person last month. 20210 Budget was submitted with a 3% raise being proposed for all staff.

Social Ministries: Bell ringing did happen, all the slots got filled. Angel Tree still has 15 names on the tree. \$270 has been donated for gift purchasing. Pastor Sheryl was asking for Council members to pick up names to purchase gifts on Wednesday (if needed) and then get reimbursed from Grant from the moneys donated. Pastor Chris has organized that some donations that were received be put towards discounts at the Emporium Coffee shop at Regional West Hospital as a thank you to area hospital personnel—the first 100 got \$2 off their purchase.

Trustees: Calm month; put up Nativity scene.

Worship & Music: took care of budget; wanted to note that the new Advent wreath stand built by Bill Huelle; decision was made to have Christmas Eve service online only. Communion and candlelight candles will be offered from 3:00-4:30.

Parish Education: Angle doing outreach by delivering bags to all the JAM kids. Becky Martin and Lynn Margheim agreed to co-lead the Parish Ed Committee starting in January, but have already met with Angle and Pastor Chris and have lots of good ideas and energy. Will continue to suspend OWLS, JAM and EPIC through January.

Financial Report: Beginning Balance: \$38,604.00 Ending Balance: \$43,608.00 Included 2 payments to Portico, so was a very healthy month. Grant thanks the congregation for their financial support during this difficult time. Accounts are getting cleaned up, so transfers will appear in December.

Pastor's /Staff Reports: Planning to take communion elements and a brief communion service to our members in Care Centers, so they can have communion-not allowed into the Care Centers so will have to leave with staff and they will use the service provided to give residents communion. The Telehealth for Mental Health Services with LFS is ready to go. Looking to work with LFS on advertising and will also share information with local pastors. Jim will check on the 4-camera set up suggested. Cost will probably be around \$150.

<u>Old Business:</u> 2021 Budget was presented to the Council after each Board had submitted their budgets to him. 3% wage increases for all staff. Most Boards are the same as last year. Proposed budget is \$323,000. Voted to accept the 2021 Budget and to present it to the Congregation at the Annual Meeting.

New Business: Updating our Constitution is in process. Amendments and changes will be emailed out by Christy. Additions are highlighted in yellow, strike-outs will be lined out. New section will clarify that Annual meetings can be held electronically, and also how to amend By-laws. Responses/comments by the Council should be addressed to Pastor Sheryl via email. Becky will send out the vote via email on the finished product.

Via email on December 7, 2020, the Calvary Council unanimously voted to approve a motion to establish a brokerage account at Platte Valley Investment Center for the purpose of receiving donations in the form of stock, with Grant Hinze, Treasurer, and Dennis Gorr, being authorized signers on the account.

Lutheran Family Service Telehealth Mental Health Services Now Available Here at Calvary

2020 has been a stressful year. If you have found the disruption of the holidays the last straw in your ability to cope there is help available through Lutheran Family Services. LFS (Lutheran Family Services) has partnered with several remote sites to provide counseling and other needs through computer teleconferencing (or Telehealth).

If you would like to take advantage of these services, specifically talking with an LFS counselor, come to Calvary and we can help connect you to a counselor! Or go on line at www.LFSneb.org and click the New Clients tab. (You can also call LFS directly at 402 -441-7940 or 1-833-903-2376.) Once on the new clients page scroll down to the Lincoln & Greater Nebraska-Adult Mental Health and click on that link to set up services for your first appointment. Be prepared to spend about 15 to 30 minutes doing online paperwork, including your insurance information.

Please, note, you can do this on your home computer or come to Calvary and use a computer specifically set up for this service. We also have a private space set apart for you to use as well. AGAIN, THIS CAN BE DONE IN THE PRIVACY OF YOUR OWN HOME, we are simply offering space and a computer and help from our office here at Calvary if you feel uncomfortable at home (not enough privacy from loved ones) or lack of computer access or just need a little coaching to navigate the computer screen.

Counseling fees will be handled directly through LFS, there is no fee for use of the computer here at Calvary, (it was provided by LFS) or for the use of the private space.

If life has you down, know there is someone to talk to and help you work through any of life's struggles including depression, relationship issues, parenting difficulties, abuse, as well as getting through this pandemic. Starting the process is available anytime on your home computer and scheduling an appt. with a counselor is very flexible on any computer with camera and internet capabilities. If you would like to use the computer here at Calvary or begin the process with assistance through the office please come Monday through Thursday from 9-3 PM. (Not available Friday or Weekends.) You may also contact us for more information.

The following information about the Covid Vaccine was recently shared with us at a local area pastors meeting with the Panhandle Public Health District. We thought the information was worth sharing with you and hope that you find it helpful.

COVID Vaccine FAQ 12.16.2020

We understand that some people may be nervous about the COVID vaccines – this is totally reasonable. Fortunately, researchers have been working on vaccines for the coronavirus family for years, so they did not have to start from scratch.

As researchers have been working intensely to develop and test the vaccine, they have been transparent in sharing data, holding live hearings, and pausing trials when it's been important to slow down. All of this has given us trust and confidence in vaccination – a critical tool in our toolbox in slowing the spread of COVID and helping our communities move forward.

We have sacrificed so much this year to keep our loved ones and community safe. While we know getting vaccinated isn't always comfortable, you can play a big role to support your community by keeping yourself and your family up-to-date on vaccinations. By staying updated on immunizations, we can make sure our sacrifice and efforts to fight COVID keep everyone safe.

- A vaccine is how we get back to as close to normal life as possible.
- It will be given in two shots. The first vaccine coming to the Panhandle will be the Moderna which is spaced 28 days apart.
- Vaccines will be available in phases with healthcare workers, long-term care facility staff and residents, and EMS prioritized first. Further information will become available with each phase when enough vaccine is available.
- The vaccine provides immunity for the COVID virus and does not contain a live virus, it introduces a protein associated with the virus to your body's immune system. Your body then creates antibodies to combat the virus if you were to be exposed.
- Common side effects are pain and swelling on the arm where you got the shot. Throughout the rest of your body: fever, chills, tiredness, and headache are also common.
- The vaccine process and studies were expedited because of the urgency of the pandemic response efforts but this does not mean that safety and effectiveness were overlooked. Current effectiveness is proven to be at 94%.
- At this point, no serious adverse events were observed in vaccine studies. There was no direct link to the vaccine and Bell's palsy in studies.
- It is currently being determined how long immunity lasts after receiving the COVID vaccine.
- There is no reasonable basis that COVID vaccines will affect fertility nor that it alters a person's DNA.
- The Pfizer and Moderna vaccines have been found to be ethically uncontroversial and the claims they were developed from aborted fetuses are untrue.
- If you have had COVID, you are still encouraged to get the vaccine once you no longer have symptoms and achieved recovery status.
- If you have had monoclonal antibody treatment, it is recommended to get the vaccine no sooner than 90 days after treatment.
- Talk to your healthcare provider if you have had a severe reaction to any previous vaccines and if the COVID vaccine is right for you. There is no link to the COVID vaccine and concerns of egg allergy.
- Vaccines are #1 of the 10 greatest 20th century public health achievements in the US. This has resulted in the eradication of many infectious diseases.
- It's important for everyone to continue using all the tools available to help stop this pandemic as we learn more about how COVID vaccines work in real-world conditions. Cover your mouth and nose with a mask when around others, stay at least 6 feet away from others, avoid crowds, and wash your hands often.


