The **Annual Meeting** for Calvary Lutheran Church is scheduled for Sunday, **January 30th** following our 10:00am Worship service.


Business to be conducted at this meeting will be the election of new council members, approval of the 2022 Budget, and receiving of reports from the Boards and Committees of the church.



Only voting members present may vote at a congregational meeting. A voting member is defined in Calvary's Constitution as a confirmed member who has communed and made a contribution of record to Calvary in the current or preceding calendar year.

## Dear friends.

I don't know about you, but somehow, when I stumbled upon this quote in an Advent devotional I was reading, it just spoke to me. I think, because so often we tend to think that to be spiritual we need to be spending lots and lots of time off by ourselves in quiet and solitude. Now, don't get me wrong; I think prayer and meditation, reading the Bible and doing devotions and worshiping are an important part of our spiritual lives, but as the above quote reminds us, our spirituality does not need to be—not should it be—compartmentalized to just one small part of our day.

If we truly believe and understand that Jesus, whose birth we just celebrated, is Emmanuel, God-With-Us, then we come to realize that God is present with us at all times and in all places. Which got me to thinking, as we approach another new year, what if, instead of making some big New Year's resolution that we quickly fail at or forget; what if we simply seek to be more aware of God's presence throughout each and every day. Looking for signs of God's presence in in the beauty of creation, in the interactions we have with one another, in each breath we take and each new day we have been blessed with.

And the funny thing is, as I was contemplating writing this newsletter article, one of our members approached me and said, 'I want to show you something!' It was a day or two after our last snowstorm and most of the snow on the sidewalk had melted away, but she happened to notice a chunk of snow in the shape of a heart. She took a picture of it to keep (see picture) and was so excited to show it to me and share how that small chunk of snow became for her a reminder of God's love and presence in our world.

When I talk about seeking to be more aware of God's presence each day, it's that kind of thing I am thinking about. Noticing those little gifts from God, letting them speak to us and giving thanks to God for them as they happen. And the wonderful thing is that with each new day, we get a chance to start all over again—no guilt, no beating up on ourselves because yesterday we didn't remember to seek God's presence—rather, just take each new day as it comes—

looking for God's presence in our world. And as we notice God's presence in our lives and in our world, we will discover, as the psalmist did, that God has filled us with joy in his presence.

# **COUNCIL MINUTES SUMMARY**

**December 13, 2021** 

**Nominating Committee:** Lora Blomenkamp has agreed to run for Secretary for next year, still don't have President-elect.

# **Board/Committee Reports:**

**Outreach:** Discussed advertising for Christmas; created invitations cards for people to invite their friends and neighbors to our Christmas Eve services.

**Elders:** Proposing a 6% increase in salaries for 2022 across the board.

**Social Ministries:** Discussed Laundry Love upcoming in January, quarters are being donated in a laundry detergent bottle between pastors' offices; Our quarterly turn at Laundry Love will be the third Saturday in January-need 2 people for 2 hours at laundromat – we already have volunteers for this; Angel tree names are all taken, gifts are coming in. Bell ringing for Salvation Army went well.

**Trustees**: Microwave in kitchen died - replaced; Nativity scene outside was put up; Kent Holub is talking with staff concerning RING cameras, quantity needed and the program to use them; installed new keypad lock on kitchen door; worked on ceiling in back hallway, new shelving, and hooks to be installed in the back hall, needs painting also; organ needed some fuses changed; started cleaning up heating radiators in the back rooms.

**Worship & Music:** Church decorated for Christmas; Services are 5 & 7 Christmas Eve; Saturday night services on Christmas and New Years are cancelled.

**Parish Education:** Children's Christmas program for the 19<sup>th</sup>; Game night with JAM was wonderful; Celebrate Generosity program in November had 7 people attending.

**Financial Report:** Beginning Balance: \$57,775.15. Ending Balance: \$48,305.08 Had 2 months of benefits to pay, scholarship payments made for spring semester as approved. Are down a little with individual giving; not surprising since we have had several members move out of the area to be closer to family. We are current with all obligations.

**Pastor's /Staff Reports:** New member Sunday on Dec. 12th. Had 5 new members join. Christmas services coming; lessons and carols service will be the Sunday after Christmas (26<sup>th</sup>); Pastors will be gone the following Sunday (Jan 2<sup>nd</sup>). Confirmation paused until January 12th.

<u>Old Business:</u> Council Dinner date will be held January 20<sup>th</sup> 6:00 at Gering Civic Center, spouses and significant others are welcome. Pastors will provide dessert as thank you to Council. Dennis will contact the Center to check date availability. Our person who removes snow (in the parking lot) is having back surgery this week. Jim will be checking with references for a replacement.

**New Business:** 2022 Budget: Grant actually got everyone's budget on time this year! Jack Martin moved, Dennis Gorr 2<sup>nd</sup> the budget, as discussed, be presented to the congregation. Only changes to the printed copy provided was to go back to the 2021 amount for the Contingency fund. Annual meeting Board reports are due in the office by January 10<sup>th</sup>. It is best if they are emailed so Christy can assemble it more easily. Reports will be available by January 22<sup>nd</sup> for the congregation.

Pastor Chris will be making Aebleskivers (Danish panckes). We will be playing The Hygge Game (also Danish)! Come join for some Danish fun!





All ladies are invited to join any of these groups.




Men's Tuesday AM Bible Study will start up again on January 4 at 8:30 a.m. as usual. We will continue our study.


