Think about devotions is as a continuation of our community's worship. The following basic pattern could be one way of forming your household's devotions. Adapt as necessary!

GATHERING

♣ Light a candle to help you focus this time as "God time."

Prayer of the Week

God, your word tells us that there is always a risk to the mission you have given your church. If your own people rejected your Son, we can expect the same. Open our hearts with kindness and mercy. Open the hearts of those with whom we come into contact, that in our words and actions, others may also know your love. Amen.

CARING CONVERSATION

Take a moment to check in with each other or to use the questions below.

- ? **Highs & Lows:** What is one thing that sent you away laughing today? What is one thing that sent you away crying?
- ? Thinking About This Week's Story: In today's story, Jesus sent out his disciples two-by-two to share God's love with everyone. As they entered a new town, they were completely reliant on the hospitality and welcome of others. Each day this week, tell about how someone welcomed you either at school, at a friend's house, greeted at work, or by the family.
- ? **Getting Ready for Next Week's Story:** Name one way you showed love today to someone? Who showed love to you?

DAILY BIBLE READING

Read aloud from the DAILY BIBLE READING from the front. What do you want to remember from this reading?

PRAY TOGETHER

[⊕] Have each person finish this prayer: Dear God, send me out today to share your love with [name one person]. Amen.

CLOSING


If you used a candle, extinguish it as a sign of the end of the devotion time.
