DEVOTIONS

Think about devotions is as a continuation of our community's worship. The following basic pattern could be one way of forming your household's devotions. Adapt as necessary!

GATHERING

♣ Light a candle to help you focus this time as "God time."

Prayer of the Week

Awesome God, Your son Jesus was raised from the dead, and the angel told the women to spread the news. Fill our lives with the hope and the promise of the resurrection, that we too might be messengers of the good news. We pray in Jesus' name. Amen.

CARING CONVERSATION

Take a moment to check in with each other or to use the questions below.

- P Highs & Lows: What is one thing that happened today that raised you up? What is one thing that happened today that brought you down?
- Thinking About This Week's Story: The promise of Jesus' resurrection is not just a "someday" promise. Because Jesus has been raised from the dead, we can be encouraged to see resurrection and new life all around us. Each day this week, name one way you saw new life by finishing this phrase: "One way I saw new life today was...". It could be something in nature, in your relationships, or actions.
- Getting Ready for Next Week's Story: What important message or email or phone call did you receive today? Did you have an important message to share with someone today? What was it about?

DAILY BIBLE READING

Read aloud from the DAILY BIBLE READING from the front. What do you want to remember from this reading?

PRAY TOGETHER

♣ After each person says a prayer of gratitude, say "Alleluia!" Close with each person saying "Amen."

CLOSING

♀ If you used a candle, extinguish it as a sign of the end of the devotion time.

₽ Rituals & Traditions: A Blessing to Share

Mark one another with the sign of the cross on each other's hands or forehead, and say, "Jesus has risen from the dead! Share this good news today. Amen."
