

DEVOTIONS

Think about devotions as a continuation of our community's worship. The following basic pattern could be one way of forming your household's devotions. Adapt as necessary!

GATHERING

✠ Light a candle to help you focus this time as "God time."

✠ Prayer of the Week

God who gathers us together, your people come from all corners of the earth. Yet you seek to gather all into the good news that Jesus is raised from the dead, giving hope and peace to any who would believe. Grant us a new appreciation for the reach of your church, and never allow us to call unclean what you have made clean. Amen.

CARING CONVERSATION

Take a moment to check in with each other or to use the questions below.

- ❓ **Highs & Lows:** Name one way you cleaned up after yourself today. Name one way you made a mess.
- ❓ **Thinking About This Week's Story:** In the story of Peter and Cornelius, Acts tells us that Cornelius was a Roman soldier, an outsider who had become a valued and respected member of the community. How have you acted like a valued and respected member of the community today?
- ❓ **Getting Ready for Next Week's Story:** Paul heals a man that had been crippled since birth. It was a miracle! Miracles happen every day if we look closely. Did you see a miracle today? A newborn baby? A butterfly?

DAILY BIBLE READING

Read aloud from the DAILY BIBLE READING from the front. What do you want to remember from this reading?

PRAY TOGETHER

✠ Dear God, please continue to love and forgive [say each person's name]. Keep us safe and close to each other. Amen.

CLOSING

✠ If you used a candle, extinguish it as a sign of the end of the devotion time.


✠ Rituals & Traditions: A Blessing to Share
