# Busy...Reconnecting with an Unhurried God

is once again our theme for our Wednesday night Lenten services. The season of Lent has often been a time when we think about "giving something up"—a holdover from its penitential flavor in the medieval church and while "giving something up" can be a helpful practice; we want to encourage you this year to think less about "giving up" and more about "making room" for God.

So join us during Lent at 6:30 p.m. on Wednesday evenings for Worship as we "make room" for God in the midst of our busy lives this Lent.

Dear Friends in Christ,

"We want our cake, and we want it now!" That might be a good motto for today's world. With instant everything from text messaging to iced tea, everything is now on demand. Nothing new here really, preachers of the gospel have often raised a critique to our impatient society. I'm including myself here (as both preacher and as one who can be impatient) Just the other day, I was in a 'big box store' fuming because there were three people ahead of me in the check out line, and I couldn't understand why they didn't open another register. I accept the fact that I am caught up in this push for the 'now'.



We may think this a modern malady, but the reality is

humankind has always been impatient. The children of Israel couldn't wait a day in the wilderness for God to do something and it didn't get any better. In Isaiah 9:1-4, the writer speaks of God's salvation coming. At this point in history, Judah is the only thing left of the nation of Israel. The writer envisions the people of Israel in a time of oppression calling out for God's redemption. Yet the writer doesn't speak of God coming to them, but to the northern areas of Naphtali and Zebulon. That is, the writer is likening God's saving work to the rising sun. First it appears in the east and then spreads across the land. God's salvation won't come immediately to Judah, it will progress and it will take time. God's people wanted God to act now, God was telling them, "Be patient."

Yes, another Lent is upon us. One of the purposes of Lent is to remind us to wait patiently on God's time. No, we can't leap from Christmas to Easter. To get to Easter from Christmas,

...AND UNTO DUST SHALT THOU RETURN

we have to go through Lent. Lent's disciplines of prayer, fasting, and giving sacrifice remind us that while Christ's work on the cross is finished and we stand in the light of God's redeeming love, God's salvation is still progressing. God's saving work is finished, but the work of redemption is still ongoing. One day that work will be completed as well. Until then we wait patiently. Lent is a good time, a good time to remind us in this 'now' generation that from the beginning God's work has taken time like well aged beef or cheese or wine.

So, slow down and make space this Lent to see God at work, in and through your life.






