So this is the time of Lent when I seriously start regretting having given up sweets for Lent. I find myself craving sweets; opening the pantry door and just staring, hoping that something will jump out at me and satisfy my craving. I've been eating more fruit, in the hopes that that will help. I've even caught myself just wandering the grocery store aisles hoping for something that will satisfy.

Of course, Lent is not all about 'giving something up' so I have been trying to be more consistent in my morning prayer time which I have been doing somewhat well at, but I have to be honest even after all these years I still struggle to make it an everyday thing. I'm not sure why, but it's sometimes hard for me to carve out time for God & even when I do, I often feel like I'm just going through the motions, that there's not a lot of depth or substance there. And I'm not blaming God; I know the problem lies with me.

And yet, there are also those times when I sit down, and God seems right there, and I feel his presence. Feel his love washing over me, his forgiveness cleansing me.

One prayer practice I have tried adding this past year, which I believe is helping me to feel more connected to God, is to use whatever scripture I have read for the day as inspiration for my prayers, sometimes I even write them down although normally I just pray my prayers in my head.

One such prayer I recently stumbled across (that I had written last spring) is based on the story of Elisha and his interactions with a woman and her family recorded in 1 Kings 4:18-37. The Woman (who has no children) cares for Elisha during a time of famine and as a reward he proclaims that she will become pregnant and give birth to a son. This is not anything she asks for, but Elisha's words prove true and she is given the gift of a son nine months later, as Elisha had prophesied. A few years later, however, the child grows ill and dies. The woman seeks out Elisha bitter that her son, that she had not asked for in the first place, has now been taken from her. Elisha, upon hearing what has happened goes to where the child is laying and raises him from the dead.

Below is the prayer I wrote based on this Bible story.

May God bless your Lenten journey.

COUNCIL MINUTES SUMMARY

February 8, 2021

Board/Committee Reports:

Nominating Committee: Thanks to Lynn Margheim for her help last year; Mary Jo Huelle will be chairing this year.

Endowment Committee: Committee changed the deadline to Jan 31 for grant applications – they will check to be sure it matches the by-laws. Some of the groups who usually raised money on the Lenten dinners were encouraged to apply for grants. There were 11 endowment requests for just over \$22,300. The following is a list of Grants the Committee approved in the amount of \$15,360:

Motion by Neal Blomenkamp to accept the grant distributions as suggested by the Endowment Committee. Motion accepted.

Outreach: Waiting until March to meet.

Elders: Christy's hours are 30 hrs/week, clarified PTO policy and tracking of hours.

Trustees: Put up blinds behind Praise Team area, Front doors and Side Window panels to the Fellowship Hall entrance were replaced and a patch of concrete was put down temporarily until a new side walk can be done in the spring.

Worship & Music: Re-started in-person worship, attendance running in the 40's. Lenten Services will happen starting with Ash Wednesday. Drive through communion and disposition of ashes will happen 12-1:00 on Ash Wednesday, February 17th in addition to the normal Ash Wednesday Worship.

Stewards: Lenten offerings will be going to the Community Food Bank; discussed parishioner who is matching funds with CAPWN for assistance with electrical bills of the needy. Stories of Faith happening around the world and in the US will be given to Council members to use/share with their committees.

Parish Education: Lynn Margheim and Becky Martin are co-chairs. They are developing the Faith 5 devotional information online to encourage families and members to do more devotions. Confirmation is going well. Hoping to have the kids do the Good Friday service.

Financial Report: Beginning Balance: \$56,897.43 Ending Balance: \$48,332.84 Part of difference due to the last deposit for January was made in February as Grant was out of town. Budget for 2021 will be entered into the software this month.

Pastor's /Staff Reports: Calvary doing well with in-church attendance. Pastors feel so good about being able to preach to live people again! Gearing up for Lent. Christy will be gone on vacation this coming Friday through next Thursday. Angie reported ~ \$750 was collected for the Cat Packs and Pup Packs programs as part of SuperBowl Sunday. JAM started in person last week, no meals right now. Will take a break during Lent. Chime choir will not start until Fall. Will be re-training acolytes and involving them in worship again. Holding off on OWLS, possibly will meet when weather is better and can be outside.

<u>Old Business</u>: Council devotional sign-up passed around again and filled. Security cameras will be purchased and installed – after tax season!

<u>New Business</u>: Endowment disbursements – see Endowment Committee report. Discussion held on a matching grant that the Lakota Lutheran Center is applying for to replace the flooring at the Center. Suggested it be placed on next month's agenda after getting more information from Pastor Will. Annual BBQ – too early to decide. Closer to date more will be known about Covid regulations. Possibly do the same as we did last year; possibly just carry-out. Think about ways it could be re-designed. To be placed on Old Business in the future.

The 4G network developed by our own Nebraska Synod has produced a series of short video clips guiding you and your family, or a friend (or two, or three!) through a wonderfully simple devotional practice called the Faith 5. All you will need is your Bible, no devotional book, commentary or study book. (Oh, and a willingness to talk!)

Once a month we will highlight one of these videos with people across the Nebraska Synod sharing together this simple way to talk, pray and learn. They will literally demonstrate sharing their 'highs' and 'lows', reading a scripture text, talking about it, (simply adding your thoughts, not what a commentary or even Pastor has to say about it), then pray for one another's highs and lows and finally bless one another. (A simple, "May you be aware of God's presence this day." is sufficient.) There will be opportunities to pause the video and add your own highs/lows, comments, prayers and blessing.

You can do this with your family, (from toddlers to great-grandparent), a friend or neighbor, a fellow member of Calvary or even someone from another church. All you need is a Bible and a way to access the video.

For the members of Calvary, we are going to set up two trees, a 'Zoom' tree, (for those who wish to connect by computer) and a phone tree (for those without computers or internet access or who simply prefer to connect by phone). To participate, simply call, email or stop in the office and say, "please add me to the phone tree or Zoom tree" and we will do the rest.

We are also looking for people with internet access who would be willing to host one of the phone groups which means you would pull up the video and share it with those who are joining via phone. Once you have listened to the video together you would then share highs/lows, thoughts, prayers and blessings with one another.

The videos run a whole ten minutes! Which means you share/read/talk/pray/bless for another 10 minutes. The entire process can be done in 20 minutes! The overall theme of the scripture texts is generosity and encourages us to see our God as a generous God. We are starting with December's video which is #12 in the series. We will post the other 11 in no particular order. It doesn't matter. What matters is the opportunity to see (or listen to how Faith 5 can work for you and allow you to practice this. Sign up, or go ahead and create your group, establish a time that works, head to Calvarylutheranscottsbluff.org and look for the video under 'Faith Formation'.






March Mission Project
