

**“I am the Bread of Life”**

**---Jesus**



**Bread for the Journey** is the theme for our Wednesday night Lenten services this year. Bread is present throughout the pages of the Bible, but especially at key times in Israel’s salvation history. This series will give us an opportunity to reflect on those ‘bread’ stories in ways that are particularly appropriate for Lent. As well, each week we will sample different breads as we explore together themes of hospitality, generosity, sufficiency, and trust which are like slices in the loaf of bread being served each week. Join us at 6:30 p.m. on Wednesday nights starting on March 2<sup>nd</sup>, Ash Wednesday for a high-carb, multi-sensory Lenten Worship Experience!

## A Lenten Pop Quiz



1) **True or False?** Lent lasts for 40 days, not counting Sundays. *True.* Even though during Lent we may put extra focus on Jesus' suffering and death; Sundays are always a celebration of Jesus' resurrection, so they do not count towards the 40 days of Lent.

2) **True or False?** The word Lent comes from an old Anglo-Saxon word meaning 'midwinter.' *False.* It actually comes from a word meaning 'springtime' since that is the time of year the season generally falls (at least in the Western world).

3) **True or False?** The 40 days of Lent are a reminder of the Bible story in which Jesus spends 40 days alone in the wilderness and is tempted by the Devil. *True.* It also recalls the 40 years the Israelites wandered in the wilderness.


4) **True or False?** Many people give up something during Lent. The point of this practice is to show your willpower. *False!* It is a practice of self-denial that reminds us in a very small way of the sacrifice Jesus suffered on our behalf so that we might be saved. When we struggle to not give in to the temptation to do or not do whatever it is we have given up; we gain a greater appreciation for the sacrifice Jesus made on our behalf.

But there is another point to this practice of self-denial and that is to create room in our life for God to do something new. So if you've vowed to give up Social Media for Lent; how might God be calling you to be more intentional about nurturing your relationships with your friends or family or even Him? If you give up pop or chocolate or lattes or eating out for Lent; perhaps God is calling you to use the money you save to provide for those who struggle to put food on their tables. If you vow to get up 1/2 hour earlier each day (giving up some of your precious sleep), how might God be calling you to spend more time with Him in prayer or praise or worship not just during Lent but throughout the year. If you decide to give up a bad habit for Lent; perhaps God is calling you to start a new, healthier, more positive habit like writing notes of thanks to those who have touched your life or keeping a gratitude journal or....you get the idea.

So as you think about your Lenten journey this year, don't worry so much about what it is you are giving up (if anything--giving up something for Lent is not actually required). Don't worry about getting it perfect and don't beat yourself up if you slip up along the way. After all, one of the most important lessons of Lent is learning to trust in the forgiveness of God offered to us through Jesus' death and resurrection—Lent, despite what you may think, is not about beating ourselves up! Rather it's about learning to walk in the grace of God. Are you creating room in your life for God to do something new?

In closing I offer this prayer for your Lenten Journey. *Gracious and merciful God, as we enter into this Lenten season, cleanse our hearts of all that separates us from you. Restore in us a right spirit and embolden us to seek your guidance for our lives and to walk in your grace each and every day. Amen.*

>**Endowment**-The endowment committee met and can disperse funds of \$18,729.47: Bill Huelle moved to approve to disperse these funds as presented to the Council; Lakota Lutheran Center – New Sign-\$2,000.00; Calvary Quilters – Supplies-\$1,000.00; Calvary Worship & Music – Sound Equip-\$500.00; Women of the ELCA – Supplies-\$800.00; Cooperative Ministries – Backpacks- \$5,000.00; Cooperative Ministries – Emergency Fund-\$3,000.00; Calvary Trustees – Education Wing Impr.-\$3,500.00; Kaetlyn Todd – Mission Trip-\$ 500.00; Calvary JAM and EPIC-\$1,000.00; Sullivan Hills Camp-\$1,429.47. Council voted to disburse funds as presented.

>**Outreach**-They are working on updating the directory before and after the Lenten dinner on 3/16. Also, before and after a select church service in April. A backdrop was purchased for taking photos in the future as needed at the church.

>**Elders**-Neal gave an update on the background checks and update on the status of the Deacons. Next meeting is in April.

>**Parish Education**-JAM is going very well, made 28 valentines, EPIC Pay it forward was fun and meaningful, Super Bowl of sharing raised \$800 that will be given to the Lakota Center. (information from Angie Hinze). OWLS will not have a meeting in March. Acolytes may start helping with communion (holding the basket to put the empty wine glasses in) if they feel comfortable doing so.

>**Social Ministry**-Getting ready for their meal on Ash Wednesday. Designated monies was discussed, and possibly going to the Lutheran Disaster Relief Fund.

>**Trustees**-Not much happening, has been pretty quiet.

>**Worship and Music**-Discussed the Lenten services and the theme of “Bread for the Journey”. Still looking for a couple of meal sponsors, may have just 1 spot left to fill.

## Penny Stevens' Fabulous Raspberry Lemon Cheesecake Bars

(Makes 18 servings)

2 c. graham cracker crumbs  
1 c. & 2 T. sugar divided (I use Splenda)  
6 T. melted butter  
3 c. raspberries (divided) (I use 2 c. raspberries & 1 c. blueberries)  
Zest of 1 lemon & juice of 1 lemon  
4 pkg cream cheese softened ( I substitute 2 c. greek low fat or nonfat yogurt)  
4 eggs

Preheat oven to 325°

Line 13x9 pan with tin foil with ends extending over sides.

COMBINE: graham crackers crumbs, 2 T. sugar (Splenda) & butter. Press into bottom of pan.

BAKE: 10 min. - Let cool.

Reserve:  $\frac{1}{2}$  c. raspberries & 1 t. zest for garnishing if desired. (I just put it all in the yogurt or cream cheese

BEAT: cream cheese, lemon juice, zest & 1 c. sugar (Splenda) in a large bowl with mixer until blended.

ADD: eggs 1 at a time; mixing on low speed after each until just blended.

GENTLY: fold in raspberries & blueberries, pour over crust.

BAKE: 35-40 min until center is almost set.

COOL: completely

Refrigerate a few hours or overnight

Use foil handles to remove cheesecake from pan before cutting into bars. (May need to loosen ends with a knife before lifting out of the pan.)


### TUESDAY NOON STUDY TO CONTINUE

### Prayers of the **OLD** Testament NEW Tuesday Evening Study @ 7 p.m. (8-week study starting March 16<sup>th</sup>)


