Tis the season of Lent. And this will be a very busy month!

I want to invite you all to attend the Panhandle Cluster Assembly being held here at Calvary on Saturday, March 2 starting at 10am. We will be gathering with people from other churches in the panhandle for worship and conversation. Our preacher and Assembly speaker will be Gretchen Ahrens, Director for Youth & Director for Youth & Synod office. Lunch will be served and we will be done by 1:00 pm or so.

I will be holding a First Communion Class on Saturday, March 9 from 9:30-11:30 am. If you have a child that would like to be a part of this, please let Christy know so we know how many to prepare for. First Communion will take place on Easter Sunday morning.

Holy Week will begin with Palm Sunday on March 24. We will NOT have worship on Wednesday, March 27 or on Saturday, March 30. There will be worship on Maundy Thursday, March 28 and Good Friday, March 29. And of course, Easter will be on Sunday, March 31!

If you attended midweek worship in February, you noticed we changed the way we give of our offerings. Individuals are invited to bring their offering forward to the altar. Even on Sunday we no longer take the offering to the back shelf but give it a place of prominence on the altar. It has always been the practice of the church that the worship service includes a time to gather offerings. We must retain this part of the liturgy as an act of discipleship and for the sake of faith.

So, don't give your money to the church. Make your offering to God. Our offerings are not about our finances, nor are they about the costs of running a church, paying a pastor, or the size of a tax break. Offering is an act of worship, acknowledging that God gives us all that we have, and practicing the spiritual gift of gratitude. The liturgical ritual of gathering the offering during worship service fosters that spiritual gift. It is a necessary rite for disciples gathered in worship. It is good and right to do so.

COUNCIL MINUTES SUMMARY

February 13, 2023

Acceptance of Agenda – Neal Blomenkamp moved to accept; Bill Huelle 2nd - accepted. Acceptance of minutes from January 8, 2023: Neal Blomenkamp moved to accept; Grant Hinze 2nd – accepted.

Board/Committee Reports:

Outreach: Discussion was had about the situation where Becca is unable to attend the Council meetings, but Jeff Van Patten is willing to be the liaison for the committee at the Council meetings. Drive Thru ashes for Ash Wednesday was announced. They discussed trying a "grab and go" lunch on the last Thursday of each month between 12:15-1. We need to find out what other groups/churches offer for free lunches to make sure we are doing it on a day that is best for all. They discussed having a BBQ along with a rummage sale sometime this summer.

Elders: They did discuss via email the Deacons situation. We are currently serving 5 people.

Parish Education: We got all programming going and now we are going to pause during Lent. The Souper Bowl of caring was well attended. \$1,000 was collected at the event with monies going to the Laundry of Love. We will have 4 confirmands to be confirmed on 5/19/24. The church will have High School graduates recognized at the 5/5/24 church service. Maunette and Val have been working on getting a young adult's group together. The kickoff for the group will be on 3/17/24. It will be held here at the church. They are having a game day and possibly having pizza or something.

Worship and Music: They met and discussed arrangements for Lent and Easter. They also discussed the Saturday night service and have made a check off list for people to use when they help with services. On Tuesday 3/5/24 Calvary is hosting a Lenten Meal at noon. The Praise team will sing during the communion song at church services and the congregation can join in if they'd like. The power point will be paused so that the person running it can come down for communion.

Social Ministry: They are preparing for the Lenten meal that they are serving. That money will be sent to the ELCA disaster relief fund and specifically given to Ukraine and Gaza.

Financial Report: Beginning Balance for January: \$32,042- Ending Balance: \$38,138

Pastor's/Staff Reports: Angie Hinze-The OWLS last Wednesday had 25 in attendance. They meet on the 2nd Wednesday of each month. The youth will be serving a Lenten Meal on 3/20/24. They are planning the Good Friday service. Pastor Kathy-She thanked the Council for their continued support. She ordered some business cards and passed some out. Then she had a reimbursement sheet for January that she submitted.

<u>Old Business:</u> Reminder to get money to the church office for the Council dinner (\$26.49/plate). Deacon's follow up-Pastor Kathy would like to have a meeting with the Deacons to make sure that what we are doing is correct as defined in the constitution.

New Business: Endowment Committee-Bill Huelle is gathering the information and will be getting a meeting together after church service on 2/18/24. Lenten Meals were discussed, making sure we have all dates covered. Planning Council duties-Shari Copsey shared the expectations and duties of the Planning Council. We need to change the constitution to read-"Congregational Planning Council. Review Mission/Vision Statement-Our goal is to get more members involved in our church. Our Vision statement is on the front of our bulletins. We also have guiding principles. Delegates for the Panhandle Cluster Spring Assembly at Calvary were discussed. Outreach board member Jeff Van Patten was approved. The motion for approval was made by Bill Huelle and seconded by Grant Hinze-approved. The duties for the Ushers and training the ushers were updated. We need to provide intentional training for all that are scheduled to serve during the worship services.
