Fourth Sunday in Lent

March 22, 2020



Widows are central to our readings from Mark for this Sunday. Jesus denounces those scribes who pray impressive prayers but devour widows' houses. He commends the poor widow who in his view gave farm more than the major donors. Jesus doesn't see her simply as an object of compassion or charity, but an example of faithfulness for all to follow.

Daily Bible Readings @ Home

Sunday – Read Mark 12:41-44 A widow leaves two coins at the temple setting an example of faithfulness and generosity. Who have been examples of faithfulness and generosity for you? Say a prayer for thanks for them and then find a way to be generous today.

Monday – Read Mark 13:1-8 Jesus foretells the destruction of the temple. This text is a great reminder for us that buildings come and go, and that our faith does not rest in the building in which we worship; but in the One in whom we worship.

Tuesday – Read Mark 13:9-13 Jesus foretells a coming period of persecution. Unfortunately, even today, there are many who still experience persecution because of their faith. Pray for all experiencing religious persecution.

Wednesday – Read Mark 13:14-20 Jesus continues his foretelling of the coming persecution. Reflect on what it would be like to have to worship in secret and hiding? How do you think that would affect your faith?

Thursday – Read Daniel 11:29-35 Daniel foretells the desecration of the temple in Jerusalem. This scripture is a good reminder to put our trust in God; that no matter what happens, God is ultimately in charge! How do you find hope and remain faithful in troubling times?

Friday – Read Mark 13:21-23 Jesus foretells false messiahs and prophets will come to lead people astray. How can you tell a false prophet from a true prophet? What traits do they have? How might their messages be different? Pray that you might not be led astray.

Saturday – Read Daniel 7:9-14 Daniel describes a vision of judgement. The Ancient One mentioned here is God and the human being (Jesus?) who is coming will inaugurate a new era of justice and peace for the world. Pray for Christ's coming and for God's justice and peace to prevail upon this earth.
