
Join us at the worship service at 10am to honor and celebrate **Emma Foote, Grace Michael, and Katie Newton** as they graduate from high school.

⁴But God, who is rich in mercy, out of the great love with which he loved us ⁵even when we were dead through our trespasses, made us alive together with Christ. ⁸For by grace you have been saved through faith, and this is not your own doing; it is the gift of God — ⁹not the result of works, so that no one may boast. ¹⁰For we are what he has made us, created in Christ Jesus for good works, which God prepared beforehand to be our way of life. Ephesians 2:2-4a, 8-10

Dear friends in Christ,

In the above verses from Paul's letter to the church in Ephesus, he reminds them (and us) that despite our sin—despite all those ways that we fall short of God's desire for our lives--we are saved—forgiven of our sins—made alive together with Christ through the grace of God. AND that we are saved—not because of works—meaning, not because of anything we have done—but through our faith in the risen Christ—and that our salvation is pure gift!

This is the good news of Easter that we have recently celebrated. But then in verse 10, Paul makes an interesting statement that I want to draw your attention to. The phrase 'what he has made us' is often translated as 'handiwork', as in, 'we are God's handiwork' but the Greek word used here is 'poiema', from which we get the word 'poem'.

In other words, according to Paul, each person, is a unique expression of God's love. Every word, every phrase, every stanza, every part of who we are has been carefully, lovingly crafted by God. And no two of us are exactly the same!

But notice what else Paul says. We are what God has made us, his handiwork, but we are created for a purpose—and that purpose is to do good works using the unique gifts with which God has created us.

As I read these verses, I am amazed at how much Paul has packed into these few verses. First, Paul lifts up the central tenet of our faith—that our salvation in Christ Jesus is a gift to us—pure gift—given to us freely by God—but having received the gift of salvation—we, who have been uniquely and lovingly created as we are by our God, are to become a gift of good works for others—and this is, to quote Paul 'to be our way of life'.

Which got me to thinking—what would happen and how might it change our perspective, even how we think about ourselves, if we began each day by saying a prayer of thanks to God for our salvation through Jesus Christ and thanking him for lovingly creating us as we are? And then being bold enough to ask "God, what good works would you have me do today?" How might asking God such a question change what we do?

COUNCIL MINUTES SUMMARY

April 12, 2021

Board/Committee Reports:

Outreach: An ad was placed in the Star-Herald for Easter; the decal project for the Breezeway is waiting on the painting of the walls. They discussed the 1st impression made when walking in the door near the Fellowship Hall, and suggestions on changes they would like to see. A photo of the Youth wall will be taken, with a photo displayed. Decals to be placed in the Narthex will be the mission statement on one side and a Bible verse on the other; they would like to put a large decal with our logo in the breezeway.

Trustees: Previous month not much happening. Will discuss with committee the suggestions given by the Outreach Committee. The ceiling in the Sanctuary is becoming a priority, waiting to hear from contractors. Jim will check with Winchells about the lawn services.

Worship & Music: Easter in-person attendance was very good; prayer books and hymnals are back in the pews. Thank you to Barb Jensen for doing that work.

Parish Education: Angie was very happy to have 20 kids doing the Watch the Lamb service on Good Friday. Started JAM up 6-7:00 on Wednesdays without meals. Meeting with EPIC kids this Sunday to make plans. Hoping OWLS can meet outside in May.

Financial Report: Beginning Balance: \$52,371.00 Ending Balance: \$56,222.95 It was noted the 3/31 payroll did not hit the bank until 4/1. Three payrolls will show up in April.

Pastor's /Staff Reports: Synod Council accepted our revisions to our constitution. Got a letter from Bishop Maas – thanking our staff and council for working with Covid-19 recommendations, encouraging their continued use and lifting them cautiously. Confirmation classes resumed this week; no youth are being confirmed this year. Senior recognition May 16th, 3 seniors will be recognized. Continuing Ed will happen for the Pastors May 17-21. Pastor Chris will be on the Synod Mission Trip May 3-7.

<u>Old Business:</u> Dennis Gorr will head up the Barbeque-less BBQ; put notice in May Tidings, donations will go 100% to Lakota Center to help them reach the funds needed to receive a matching grant which will allow them to replace the flooring at the Center. Security cameras. Changes on signature cards for the Endowment Fund are done. June 13th is Nancy Steele's 25 anniversary as a PMA.

The 4G network developed by our own Nebraska Synod has produced a series of short video clips guiding you and your family, or a friend (or two, or three!) through a wonderfully simple devotional practice called the Faith 5. All you will need is your Bible, no devotional book, commentary or study book. (Oh, and a willingness to talk!)

Once a month we will highlight one of these videos with people across the Nebraska Synod sharing together this simple way to talk, pray and learn. They will literally demonstrate sharing their 'highs' and 'lows', reading a scripture text, talking about it, (simply adding your thoughts, not what a commentary or even Pastor has to say about it), then pray for one another's highs and lows and finally bless one another. (A simple, "May you be aware of God's presence this day." is sufficient.) There will be opportunities to pause the video and add your own highs/lows, comments, prayers and blessing.

You can do this with your family, (from toddlers to greatgrandparent), a friend or neighbor, a fellow member of Calvary or even someone from another church. All you need is a Bible and a way to access the video.

For the members of Calvary, we are going to set up two trees, a 'Zoom' tree, (for those who wish to connect by computer) and a phone tree (for those without computers or internet access or who simply prefer to connect by phone). To participate, simply call, email or stop in the office and say, "please add me to the phone tree or Zoom tree" and we will do the rest.

We are also looking for people with internet access who would be willing to host one of the phone groups which means you would pull up the video and share it with those who are joining via phone. Once you have listened to the video together you would then share highs/lows, thoughts, prayers and blessings with one another.

The videos run a whole ten minutes! Which means you share/read/talk/pray/bless for another 10 minutes. The entire process can be done in 20 minutes! The overall theme of the scripture texts is generosity and encourages us to see our God as a generous God. We are starting with December's video which is #12 in the series. We will post the other 11 in no particular order. It doesn't matter. What matters is the opportunity to see (or listen to how Faith 5 can work for you and allow you to practice this. Sign up, or go ahead and create your group, establish a time that works, head to Calvarylutheranscottsbluff.org and look for the video under 'Faith Formation'.
