### **Hymn Sing, November 13th & 14th**



## **NEW Pastor's Tuesday Evening Study starting Nov. 16th**

### **The Heart that Grew 3 Sizes: Finding Faith in the story of the Grinch.**

We don't know why the Grinch hated Christmas. We just know he did. In this new Advent study, Pastor Matt Rawle explores the faith themes in the Christmas classic, *How the Grinch Stole Christmas!* including, how did the Grinch's heart grow three sizes come Christmas morning? How did Christmas save the Grinch? Could it be that the very thing we think we hate is the one thing that changes our lives? ## **\*CORRECTIONS FROM NOVEMBER TIDINGS**



People are interested in the amount of supplies needed, the following are some statistics:

- 3 sheets per quilt = 1,050 (One sheet for the middle and one for the back.) Cotton or cotton blend old sheets, pillowcases and fabric are best. They CANNOT use flannel, knit, or polyester fabric because they stretch. Sheets with stains can be used in the middle.
- 48 blocks for each top = 16,800 - 10" blocks equaling 2.65 miles end to end
- 300" of border = 8,750' or 1.65 miles. Blocks and border are the 3rd sheet per quilt.
- 45' per quilt or 2.98 miles of yarn. They have been blessed with an oversupply of yarn and do NOT need more!
- 310 yards of thread per quilt or 61.65 miles of thread (only an estimate!)

If you can use a sewing machine, iron, or tie a knot, they have something for you to do and would sure enjoy your company Tuesday afternoons from 1-3:00.
