

Dear friends.

I think we can all agree it's been a rough year with all of us feeling the stress and strain in so many different ways of living through a pandemic and now here we are heading into November, the month of Thanksgiving, and there's a very good chance that your Thanksgiving celebrations will look different than they have in the past with fewer people gathered around your table or perhaps even doing Thanksgiving Dinner via Zoom as my brother suggested this past week.

Which got me to thinking. Thanksgiving itself, is a day generally set apart for giving thanks for all the blessings or gifts that we have received, but I can imagine that for many folk the idea of giving thanks this year might be a struggle.

It is so easy in our world to focus on the bad, on the things that we don't have or the things that have gone wrong and I by no means mean to deny or diminish the impact that those things have on our lives, but if the only things we can see or think about are what's gone wrong or what we lack, we will find ourselves hopeless and depressed. Which is why I think God calls us in scripture over and over again to give thanks, because giving thanks reframes how we view the world and our lives; it gives us hope and reenergizes us for the tasks ahead.

Paul, in his letter to the Philippians, a letter by the way that he writes from jail, writes "Do not worry about anything, but in everything by prayer and supplication with thanksgiving let your requests be made known to God. And the peace of God, which surpasses all understanding, will guard your hearts and your minds in Christ Jesus." (Phil 4:6-7) And then these words a little further on, "I know what it is to have little, and I know what it is to have plenty. In any and all circumstances I have learned the secret of being well-fed and of going hungry, of having plenty and of being in need. I can do all things through him who strengthens me." (Phil 4:12-13).

So as we enter into November and the pandemic continues for the foreseeable future, not to mention the normal trials of life, I want to challenge you to a spiritual discipline of gratefulness, not just on Thanksgiving Day, but throughout the month of November and perhaps beyond. And all you need is a notebook or a few sheets of paper or some means of recording to create a gratitude journal. Then each day, write down at least 3 things that you have to give thanks for and when you are done writing down your 3 thanksgivings, take a moment and say a simple prayer of thanks to God for the gifts that he has given.

I'll start! I am thankful for a God who loves me unconditionally. I am thankful for a warm house on a snowy October morning. I am thankful for a husband who loves me and forgives me over and over again even though I don't deserve it. Now it's your turn. I am thankful for....

COUNCIL MINUTES SUMMARY

October 12, 2020

Board/Committee Reports:

Nominating Committee: Dennis Gorr, Mary Jo Huelle and Kathy Randall have agreed to run for their offices again; the committee will meet tomorrow at 5:00 to discuss other positions needing to be filled. LaDonna asked the chairs of committees to check with their committee members to see if they are willing to serve another term and then report back to LaDonna.

Outreach: The vinyl window/auto decals and a short article will be in the October issue of the Tidings. If people want to make a donation to offset printing cost, they are welcome to drop it off at the church office. The Christmas service invitation postcard will be developed. Mary Jo will set up a text reminder for our committee meetings.

Elders: Discussed Pastor Appreciation month and thank you for Mary Jo Huelle. Put together a Child/Youth Protection Policies to meet insurance requirements. It covers both staff and volunteer positions. Applications, background checks every 5 years are to be kept on file for staff; also, for volunteers if they will be with youth on an overnight situation. It sets out a forum to handle various situations were they to arise. Council is to read through it and give any comments to Neal by the end of the week.

Social Ministries: Crop Walk yesterday, very windy, 6 people from Calvary walked. Habitat for Humanities is on hold until the Covid-19 situation is more settled. Meeting Wednesday this week.

Trustees: Meeting this coming Saturday to get property ready for winter. A plexiglass barrier on the front of the balcony will be installed so choir can perform again. Things are a work in progress.

Worship & Music: Moved communion back up to the front and into the normal time during worship. Meet next Monday night, will work on how to adapt to guidelines for Christmas services. Joint service with Rejoice will not happen this year.

Stewards: November 15th Consecration Sunday; video will be played during the service, structured around the theme of what do you do to keep things simple.

Parish Education: Discussion of the difficulty of finding people interested in assisting/advising on Parish Ed. Discussion was held about whether there should be more restrictions with JAM because of rising Covid cases. Up until now they have been outside for a good portion of the night, but the weather probably will not cooperate from here on. Becky will send the (school) advisements for extra-curricular activities to Angie and Pastors so they have latest information. Discussed following the school's protocols as far as masking and gathering. Another possibility discussed was not serving a meal, which would limit the amount of contact time and time without masks. Council voted that meals for JAM be suspended for the time being and masks be mandatory as long as the county is in the orange range for Covid-19. The Council will continue to monitor the situation.

Financial Report: Beginning Balance: \$37,102.74 Ending Balance: \$36,630.10 September included 2 Portico payments and an insurance payment. It was discovered and noted Becky Martin had not been paid – will be corrected. Some memorial money (from 3 memorials) was received this month. When forgiveness of the PPE loan is confirmed, it will be recognized as common income.

Pastor's /Staff Reports: Email from Bishop Maas recommending that in-person meetings be suspended if the infection rate increases to over 20 per 100,000 for a 7-day running average. We're at 11.79 right now. It gives a solid objective measurement from which we can determine whether or not to do services and activities in person. Council agreed to follow Bishop's recommendation.

Old Business:

Child & Youth Protection Policy – see Elders report

We now have all the cameras we need for live streaming our services.

New Business:

Lutheran Family Services wishes to expand to the Western part of Nebraska through Telehealth, Mental Health for assistance via counselors on live online sessions. We would become the connecting point for LFS. It will affect the church office manager, who will need to help people fill out forms. LFS also has funds available through the CARES Act. Again, we would help fill out forms, but NOT monitor anything. Financial assistance and mental health resources. We supply space, help with forms, and help people get connected with LFS. Joel will be here the 1st week in November to address anyone interested. We set the hours. Possibly a volunteer could be used to assist Christy if necessary. Pastor Chris sees it as meeting needs of someone coming in off the street. Council felt like they needed more information before making a decision. Pastors will contact Joel, to set up a Zoom meeting with Council for 10/26, or 11/2 @ 6:00 p.m..

Next Meeting will be held November 9, 2020

Please feel free to ignore Facebook's attempt to have you log-in or create an account!) We will also save the video to our Facebook page for viewing at a later time. Bulletins with congregational responses and hymns for the worship services will be placed on our website and also emailed to everyone who is on our Calvary Lutheran email list, so you may download or print off the bulletin ahead of time to more fully participate in the worship service wherever you may be. The bulletin will also include weekly announcements and prayer lists. Not on our Calvary email list? Contact the church office, and give us your email address and we will be happy to add you to our list.

In-Person Worship Update: As you well know, the pandemic crisis continues to affect (and infect) our lives and unfortunately Covid-19 cases in our state and county have risen dramatically in the last couple of weeks. In response to this rise, Bishop Maas, our Nebraska Synod Bishop, has set a guideline in consultation with state health experts regarding holding inperson worship. This guideline is based on the seven-day rolling average from data submitted to the State. Based on the present 7-day average, in-person worship has been suspended until further notice.

We will, of course, livestream the Sunday morning worship service and encourage everyone to worship with us online via Facebook Live by visiting our Facebook page or using the link on website. We will also continue with drive through communion from approximately 10:45 to 11:15 a.m. following the Sunday Morning Worship Service, for those who are interested in receiving Holy Communion.

Going forward, our plan is to check the infection rate on Wednesdays and if the infection rate is above 20, there will be no in-person worship for the upcoming weekend. Should the infection rate be below 20 on Wednesday, we will plan on holding in-person worship for the upcoming weekend. Once we make the decision on whether we will hold in-person worship or not, we will email everyone on our email list, post the decision on our Facebook page and Website, or you may call the church office by noon on Friday to receive that information as well. (if you are not on our email list and would like to receive the email when it is sent out, please contact the church office to give us your email address.)

Keeping it Simple Consecration Sunday November 15th

Life can get complicated. No more so than now in the midst of a pandemic. We have two in the congregation who are currently in quarantine (exposed, not positive) and worship is week by week, on again—off again. Decisions about gathering as family for the upcoming holidays and even going to the grocery store are not easy and can be exhausting.

It's a good time to keep it simple. We will be showing four videos on upcoming Sunday mornings of people who have struggled through various situations. They all have one thing

in common. They learned while life can be complicated, keeping our faith simple is good stewardship. Losing everything in a flood, reminds us how temporal possessions are. Being stewards of the land—whether large farm operations or small produce farms, staying ahead of commodity prices, planting and harvesting are complicated and surviving means staying focused on the keeping things simple.

As we prayerfully consider our support of God's work here at Calvary, we are reminded that God's love is as big as the universe and truly beyond our comprehension, that God would pursue us even through death on the cross, yet God's love comes to us in simple ways: water, bread and wine. It comes in the caring of a neighbor. It comes in the reassuring presence of the Spirit.

In what ways has God reminded you to keep it simple in these days of pandemic, especially when you start to feel overwhelmed? This can be a good time to reach out through a phone call, text or note. Call on the Pastors, and share your struggle. Remind yourself the struggle is complicated but God comes simply and walks with us.

In response we offer our prayers and commitments to God's work here at Calvary. Look for a letter containing a pledge card. Please prayerfully consider your response and return it by November 15th. We will gather all the commitments and place them on the altar dedicating them to our God in gratefulness for all God has done for us. We're going to keep it simple this year.



People are interested in the amount of supplies needed, the following are some statistics:

- 3 sheets per quilt = 864 (One sheet for the middle and one for the back.) Cotton or cotton blend old sheets, pillowcases and fabric are best. They CANNOT use flannel, knit, or polyester fabric because they stretch. Sheets with stains can be used in the middle.
- 48 blocks for each top = 13,824 10" blocks equaling 2.18 miles end to end
- 300" of border = 7,200' or 1.4 miles. Blocks and border are the 3rd sheet per quilt.
- 108 yarn ties = 45' per quilt or 2.5 miles of yarn. They have been blessed with an oversupply of yarn and do NOT need more!
- 310 yards of thread per quilt or 50.7 miles of thread (only an estimate!) If you can use a sewing machine, iron, or tie a knot, they have something for you to do and would sure enjoy your company Tuesday afternoons from 1-3:00.
