

COUNCIL MINUTES SUMMARY

October 11, 2021

Board/Committee Reports:

Outreach: They are updating the rack cards. Parish Ed. requested a postcard for JAM. The church website needs to be updated with current Pastor information. Pastor Brett will take care of this. They will plan to use the electronic sign in the front of our church and the Star Herald to recognize Pastor Brett for Pastor appreciation. November 16th will be their next meeting.

Elders: They discussed the secretarial job hours as being Monday-Friday from 8-2. Christy is scheduling the deacons for visits. It's going well. Spoke about the need to follow up on possible new members that have been coming to services.

Social Ministries: The quilt for the Ewings is almost complete and will be delivered to them soon. The CROP walk was well attended with 25 participants and nice weather.

Trustees: They had the bells checked and serviced. The fire department did this. Discussed giving the fire department a donation of some type. They checked out heating system and all was well.

Worship & Music: 10/30/22 is Reformation Sunday. We will dedicate the items that the Memorial money paid for most recently. They are in the planning stages of having a "Thankful" service in November. This would be held on Sunday 11/20/22 which is the Sunday before Thanksgiving.

Parish Education: JAM, EPIC, OWLS, are meeting and all is going well. It was mentioned that we may need more laundry detergent for Laundry Love.

Financial Report: Beginning Balance for June: \$22,694.60 Ending Balance: \$18,326.74 Nothing out of the ordinary is happening in the general account. Not much activity in the common account. Motion was made by Jim Dorn to use money from the contingency fund to cover the extra cost incurred from the retirement dinner. Dawn Holub 2nd-accepted. Neal Blomenkamp moved to accept the financial report as given; Bill Huelle 2nd-accepted.

Pastor's /Staff Reports: September was a challenging month for Pastor Brett and his family as they were recovering from COVID along with Christy having it too. Funeral service for Gloria Gorr happened. Pastor is connecting with the deacons and home visits are beginning. Confirmation is starting up. There are 7 participants. The staff at the church is great and have been so helpful. The pumpkin patch trip was FUN!! Saturday night services were discussed. How should we handle the low attendance of this service? Pastor Brett talked to Pastor Jon about the prayer work and Calvary telling "our story" work. Doesn't seem to be as rigid as first thought. Our church membership in reference to adult Ed brings a question as to how do we age graciously in this time of transition? That might be helpful with the demographics of our church membership where a large number of members are in the season of life that are leaving work and in retirement.

<u>Old Business:</u> Nominating committee-they have not met. Mary Jo agreed to stay on as President for another year through 2023. We are looking for a good, strong Vice President Candidate. We discussed the Prayer meeting/tell our story topics.

Fun Quilting Facts

People are interested in the amount of supplies needed; the following are some statistics:

- 3 sheets per quilt = 1,008 (one sheet for the middle and one for the back.) Cotton or cotton blend old sheets, pillowcases and fabric are best. They CANNOT use flannel, knit, or polyester fabric because they stretch. Sheets with stains can be used in the middle.
- 48 blocks for each top = 16,128 10" blocks equaling 2.55 miles end to end
- 300" of border = 8,400' or 1.6 miles. Blocks and border are the 3rd sheet per quilt.
- 108 yarn ties = 45' per quilt or 2.86 miles of yarn. They have been blessed with an oversupply of yarn and do NOT need more!
- 310 yards of thread per quilt or 59.2 miles of thread (only an estimate!)

If you can use a sewing machine, iron, or tie a knot, they have something for you to do and would sure enjoy your company Tuesday afternoons from 1-3:00.


