Are we there yet? A popular refrain from the back seat by a bored youngster, whose game batteries have died and doesn't have their own phone yet. The drive, whether it's just across town or across the country ,becomes something to simply be endured.

It seems that 2020 has become that kind of ride. Some hope on November 3rd it will all be over, all the hype, hysteria, and health warnings will fade away. Some are pouting and kicking the back of the front seat to make sure everyone knows how annoyed they are. Some are just glaring out the window resentful they have to be in the car at all. That's 2020.

For us there is an alternative, and I think this alternative is important for us o consider since we still have a third of 2020 left. The writer of Hebrews urges us to 'run with perseverance the race that is set before us' with our eyes on Jesus (Hebrews 12:1). Keeping our focus on Jesus is more than an old gospel hymn cliché, rather it encourages the faithful (that's us!) to keep our heads up, our eyes on Jesus (and on Jesus' words and deeds for inspiration and encouragement) and to keep running the race of life and faith; not getting discouraged and not giving up just because the race is not as easy as we thought it would be.

This doesn't mean we ignore 2020 and all that is going on around us. These words of encouragement come on the heels of a long list of those who have run in different times and diverse backgrounds but all meeting struggles and hardship with God's help. They journeyed on faithfully, wrestling with adversity 'by faith conquered kingdoms, administered justice, obtained promises...' (Hebrews 11:35). The writer calls these individuals our 'fan base' cheering us on in our own journeys.

Keeping our eyes on Jesus we meet the continuing challenges and face them. Lately, I have been given to saying, "Can 2020 get any worse?" I've stopped saying that as new fires break out, hurricanes continue to slam the south and political tensions just seem to boil hotter and hotter. Yes, there is time left in 2020 for a lot to happen.

Who knows? Still we pray, 'Thy kingdom come, Thy will be done, ON EARTH, as it is in heaven. Setting our eyes on Jesus doesn't mean we can simply stare out the window waiting for 2020 to finally end. Jesus didn't just endure the journey, and keeping our eyes on him reminds us of our calling to be disciples, following in His footsteps. Footsteps that walked through throngs of people and having compassion on them, walking along calling out to the lonely and the hurting, the sinners and the tax collectors, the widows and orphans.

Being forced to shut down in 2020, didn't mean we took an extended vacation, but it did challenge our whole sense of ministry and how we did ministry. I must confess, I, at least, am still not sure what our 'new' sense of ministry and how we do it is. But one thing is clear we continue to keep our eyes on Jesus and continue to run with perseverance the race that is set before us and we bid you to join us.

September 14, 2020

Board/Committee Reports:

Nominating Committee: LaDonna Schmidt reporting. Asked if chairperson of committees are to find their own people, or if it is the responsibility of the Nominating Committee. She would like help!

Outreach: Meeting Wednesday, 9/16.

Elders: Training of Christy by Grant is going well.

Social Ministries: had the backpack filling yesterday; needs more supplies to complete them all. Crop Walk is tentatively scheduled for October 11th at 2:00.

Trustees: Worked on the fence on the back of the lot. Took out old posts; extended fence by 2 sections.

Worship & Music: Yesterday, Facebook would not hook – it was a Facebook problem, other churches had the same problem. Will go over new Covid rules at next meeting. Getting a new Advent wreath – Bill Huelle will create it, so don't need the Memorial money. Mary Jo explained a few needed written directions for the Power Point section/AV person. Need to record the service so it can be uploaded later when online problems occur.

Stewards: Working on stewardship theme of Make It Simple. Got the videos wanted, need to figure out how to use in the service.

Parish Education: JAM begins on Wednesday night. Dinner @ 6:00; spend as much time outdoors as possible; will coincide with Sunday lessons. EPIC first meeting is swim party at Randalls. OWLS will be outdoor lunch in October.

Financial Report: Beginning Balance: \$29,006.68 Ending Balance: \$37,102.74. No payment to Portico, which is why balance is so high. Christy is now preparing the checks with Grant signing checks. Donations have continued to be high during this time. Dennis Gorr moved, Jim Dorn 2nd to accept the financial report – accepted

Pastor's /Staff Reports: Two youth for confirmation this year. Needed options for other nights to meet, came up with a Zoom meeting every other Tuesday evening, hopefully that will work. A youth from Holy Apostles will join the Calvary youth. October 25 will be Confirmation Sunday for those who finished last year. Will not have a Confirmation Sunday this coming spring, as both youth are doing their first year. Weekend of 9/26-27 they will be on vacation - they will run the half marathon in the Monument Marathon on Saturday and need to recover! Starting Pastor's Bible study in October. Adult Sunday School will not start now, the time is needed to greet parishioners as they come to church.

Old Business:

Phase 4 Covid Rules begin Monday. Worship Committee will address it in next meeting. In-church attendance is creeping up slowly. We could go to 75% capacity, but can't open more places because of the 6 ft distance recommendation. JAM masks not required, but encouraged.

Insurance update – everything is signed. Jim will follow up with the part of the policy that requires Calvary to have a Child & Youth Protection Policy on file with the company.


October Mission

Do you miss being able to follow along with the music when we sing a hymn or song during worship? Hymnals are available to borrow for those who wish one. We only




