Does it seem like all we do is talk past each other anymore? Economy, financial, family, Covid, political divisions, it all reminds me of a song:

Try to see it my way
Do I have to keep on talking 'til I can't go on?
While you see it your way
Run the risk of knowing that our love may soon be gone?
We can work it out.

Sound familiar? These are the lyrics from a song by the Beatles. Like many of the Beatles songs, it contains a not so subtle sarcasm. In this song it's trying to convince one's partner to change their mind. And begs the question, Is there any hope for working something out? It seems that's a big question lately and one that only seems to become shriller each and every day. So is there a chance to work it out?


I think the answer is, "No and yes." First and always we must hear the 'no'. Like a child reaching for a hot stove, you can't take time to reason with them, you just say, "No!" I am not saying that peace is impossible, 'no' means simply, acknowledging that what we are doing is not working, so stop what you are doing! Too many times, we get trapped into thinking, "If we just try harder..." This means, if I am a little more forceful with my ideas, my plans, my way of doing things, it will all work out. To this we must hear the word, "No."

You may think I am speaking mostly about our political climate, but what about our families? How many times do we think, if only my spouse would do what I think, things would be okay. Of course our children are supposed to obey us, if I could just get them to listen to me! What might happen if we stopped for a moment and listened to them?

To work it out often takes listening and especially listening to God. So what does God say? As Christians, this is where we need to begin, and not surprisingly the first thing we often hear is God saying 'no'. In the book of Isaiah, where Isaiah lifts up a wonderful vision of people working it out, God tells Isaiah, "For my thoughts are not you thoughts, nor are your ways my ways, says the Lord. For as the heavens are higher than the earth, so are my ways higher than your ways and my thoughts higher than yours." Isaiah 55:8-9. Too often we think we know what God's going to say and when we do, that's when we hear God say loudly, 'no'.

If we can stop talking long enough to listen, then we have a chance to see things work out, maybe not our way, but God's way. It is when we first hear this 'no' that we can experience the truth of the Apostle Paul's benediction, "May the peace of Christ dwell richly in your hearts. To which you were called..." Colossians 3:15. Finding peace with each other is possible, but first what that might it mean is hearing a 'no'. Max Lucado in a book called 'Anxious For Nothing', says saying 'no' to our anxieties, by saying 'yes' to God is the first step to working things out in our families, our relationships, and maybe even the world around us!

COUNCIL MINUTES SUMMARY

September 13, 2021

Nominating Committee: Asked each Board committee chair to check with people on their committee to see who is returning and let her know of any changes.

Board/Committee Reports:

Outreach: no meeting, decals were put up in July; will be meeting Monday

Elders: Prep work was done to be able to do background checks as required by our insurance company. Two people will be able to do the checks.

Social Ministries: Habitat for Humanity date was postponed due to materials not arriving. People can join in on weekdays as they want; Board will be selecting a day in October. Laundry of Love coordinator is Maunette Loeks-Van Patten. We will probably have to cover only one day every 3 months. Crop Walk is coming October 3rd.

Trustees: Back door electrical is working for handicapped entry but the electrician still has some work to do; windows in breezeway replaced; pigeons in the courtyard are gone. Some discussion on the 'Ring' doorbell has taken place, more research will happen. Pastor Sheryl mentioned there have been issues with printing the bulletin. Bytes or Connecting Point will hopefully be able to solve the issues.

Worship & Music: Generosity Event and Ice Cream Social yesterday was very well received. Pleased with turn out. We are once again making our own communion bread. People enjoyed fellowshipping in the Fellowship Hall after the service. There was a suggestion to have a hymn sing on the 5th Sunday again, it will be discussed. Providing words for hymns being requested would be a challenge for those worshipping online. Becky Martin wanted to know if we will have a joint service with Rejoice in November. It is doubtful but will be discussed.

Parish Education: Fall youth programs (JAM & EPIC) are underway. OWLS continued through the summer. Celebrate Event was well attended.

Financial Report: Beginning Balance: \$55,910.94 - July 1st Ending Balance: \$50,100.25 August 31st

Pastor's /Staff Reports: Went to Annual Cluster Retreat. A wedding is scheduled for October 3rd. Scheduling 1st Communion class. Have 8 attendees in Confirmation class, 1 from Holy Apostle and 7 from Calvary. Week of Oct 18th they will be out attending both Lutheran and Episcopal meetings.

<u>Old Business:</u> Hybrid Church Webinar: discussions after each video were good. Online "dead time" while communion is happening may need to be addressed. Two stations have been introduced to speed up the process. Suggested we check out other online church services to see if there are things we can add/change/include or NOT include. Covid Concerns: discussed what future possibilities might be. No change of policy at this point. It can be addressed again in the future.

New Business: Pastor Appreciation in October, requested 10th and 17th as Sundays.

Next meeting will be held October 11, 2021




