‡Affirmation of Baptism‡

Dear friends, we give thanks to God for the gift of baptism and for these Confirmands, one with us in the body of Christ, who are making public affirmation of their baptism this day.

Leader: I present Ella Ryan Foote & Casey Theron Miller who desire to make public affirmation of their baptism.

P: Let us pray. Merciful God, we thank you for Ella & Theron whom you have made your own by water and the word in baptism. You have called them to yourself, enlightened them with the gifts of your Spirit, and nourished them in the community of faith. Uphold your servants as they affirm the gifts and promises of baptism, and unite the hearts of all whom you have brought to new birth through the sacrament of Holy Baptism. We ask this in the name of Christ. **Amen.**

Renunciation of Evil

P: As you affirm your baptism, I ask you to reject sin, profess your faith in Christ, and confess the faith of the church. Do you renounce the devil and all the forces that defy God?

Response: **I renounce them.**

P: Do you renounce the powers of this world that rebel against God?

Response: **I renounce them.**

P: Do you renounce the ways of sin that draw you from God?

Response: **I renounce them.**

Profession of Faith

P: Do you turn to Christ as your Lord and Savior?

Response: **In faith, I turn to Christ.**

P: With the whole church, let us confess our faith.

P: Do you believe in God the Father?

I believe in God, the Father almighty, creator of heaven and earth.

P: Do you believe in Jesus Christ, the Son of God?

I believe in Jesus Christ, God's only Son, our Lord, who was conceived by the Holy Spirit, born of the virgin Mary, suffered under Pontius Pilate, was crucified, died, and was buried; he descended to the dead. On the third day he rose again;

he ascended into heaven, he is seated at the right hand of the Father, and he will come to judge the living and the dead.

P: Do you believe in the Holy Spirit?

I believe in the Holy Spirit, the holy catholic church, the communion of saints, the forgiveness of sins, the resurrection of the body, and the life everlasting. Amen.

Commitment by Confirmands

P: You have made public profession of your faith. Do you intend to continue in the covenant God made with you in Holy Baptism: to live among God's faithful people, to hear the word of God and share in the Lord's supper, to proclaim the good news of God in Christ through word and deed, to serve all people, following the example of Jesus, and to strive for justice and peace in all the earth?

Confirmands: **I do, and I ask God to help and guide me.**

Recitation of Confirmation Verses

P: People of God, do you promise to support Ella & Theron praying for them in their life in Christ?

C: We do, and we ask God to help and guide us.

Will the parents and guardians of our Confirmands, please come forward at this time.

Prayer of Blessing

P: Let us pray. We give thanks, O God that through water and the Holy Spirit you give us new birth, wash us from sin, and raise us to eternal life. Stir up in Ella & Theron the gift of your Holy Spirit: the spirit of wisdom and understanding, the spirit of counsel and might, the spirit of joy in your presence, both now and forever.

C: Amen.

Parental Blessing

In Christian love you presented your children for Holy Baptism. In their baptisms, sacred promises were made. As parents of these young men and women, it was part of your calling to see that those sacred promises were kept: to faithfully bring them to the services of God's house, to teach them the Lord's Prayer, the Creed and the Ten Commandments. to place in their hands the Holy Scriptures and to provide for their instruction in the Christian faith." You have fulfilled those promises.

We now ask you to renew the covenants you made for the ongoing support of these young people's faith journeys. Do you intend to continue to worship, study and pray regularly with your youth?

If so, answer: ***"I do, and I ask God to help and guide me."***

Now parents and sponsors, I ask you to place your hand on your youth's head or shoulder and bless them: ***"May our blessing rest upon you as you enter a new stage in your walk of faith. God's blessing be upon you. May our Risen Lord sustain you, encourage you and guide you throughout your lives. May you always know the joy and strength that comes from being a child of God. Amen."***

JAM will be on Wednesdays!





CARING CONVERSATIONS



Discuss in your home, small group, or use for personal reflections:

- Talk or think about what it takes to have a strong, ongoing relationship with a friend.
- What gets in the way of a friendship?
- Talk or think about what it takes to have a strong, ongoing relationship with Jesus.

DEVOTIONS



Read: John 8:31-36.

It is the power of the word that Jesus brings that gives us freedom from sin. That word is first and foremost Jesus, the Word that became flesh (John 1:14). Christian disciples "continue" or remain in the freeing and saving word of God. The Gospel of John emphasizes that the follower of Jesus has an ongoing relationship to him by continuing "in my word" (8:31). To know the truth that sets one free is more than to know information; it is to live in a relationship to Jesus through faith. The challenge at the time of the Reformation—and today as well—is for the church to promote a living relationship with God, a relationship that depends on faith in Jesus, the Son of God. We experience this relationship through worship, prayer, reading the Bible, and serving and loving one's neighbor for the sake of Christ. How do you continue to live each day as a disciple of Jesus?

Pray: Almighty God, help me to trust in Jesus Christ, your Son, our Lord and have life in his name. Amen.

SERVICE



Martin Luther wrote, "God does not need your good works, but your neighbor does." An important theme of the Reformation is that all Christians are called to serve others through their baptisms. Think about friends and neighbors in your community who may need help or support in some way. What good works can you do to serve them in Jesus' name?

RITUALS AND TRADITIONS



Martin Luther wrote the words for *A Mighty Fortress Is Our God* and composed the melody. This well-known hymn is based on Psalm 46. After reading this psalm once, make a list of words from it that help you understand God as a mighty fortress. Read Psalm 46 again and pause for a moment when you read a word from your list. After finishing, say, "Amen."
