DEVOTIONS



Read: 1 Peter 2:11-17.

In these passages we are asked to live as God's servants should and not use our freedom as an excuse for doing wrong. Unfortunately, there are still many people in the world today whose freedom is limited because of personal or social circumstances. In your devotions please remember and pray for the following:

- Those who live in places where personal freedoms are restricted
- Those who have been wrongly imprisoned
- Those who lack freedom due to poverty
- Those who are unable to freely practice their faith
- Those who serve communities and nations to keep others free

Pray: Almighty Father, please grant all people the freedom you have given us. Amen.



Galatians 5:14 tells us to use our freedom "as an opportunity to serve each other with love." In response to these words and in honor of this special day, plan an Independence Day act of loving service. For example: Visit someone in a hospital or nursing home, visit a cemetery and place flowers on a war veteran's grave, invite someone to join you for the holiday, clean up litter in your neighborhood, or help a neighbor with some household task.

RITUALS AND TRADITIONS



From 1776, when on July 2nd the Continental Congress voted in favor of independence from Great Britain, and two days later its delegates adopted the Declaration of Independence which had been drafted by Thomas Jefferson, until the present day, July 4th has been celebrated as the birth of American Independence. Obtain a copy of the Declaration of Independence and read it aloud as a group. Sing or recite a national hymn like O Beautiful for Spacious Skies. Take time to quietly reflect on the message of the hymn and the power and glory of God and what it has meant for our country.
